## Police briefs

### Youth assaulted

A 16-year-old Acton youth has been charged with assault with a weapon and threatening death after he assaulted another Acton youth on the corner of Queen and Young Streets in Acton Wednesday evening. The accused confronted the 16-year-old victim with a golf club iron. Police say, he repeatedly poked the victim with the club, then pushed his head through a window, after which he threatened the youth's life, according to police.

Last Thursday the same suspect was charged with theft under \$1,000 and possession of stolen property after police apprehended him in Milton with a personalized licence plate, which was removed from a vehicle parked at Action Auto in Acton.

### Fraud warning

Police are on the lookout for an Italian male after he unsuccessfully attempted to swindle a Georgetown store clerk of \$50 Tuesday afternoon. Police say the man entered the Main St. business and asked to "borrow" the money to fix his car, which he said had just broken down. He offered his car keys as collateral, but the clerk refused. He then attempted to go behind the counter to use the phone, but the clerk blocked his way.

Police believe the same man successfully escaped with \$50 from a Milton dry cleaners several hours later. The suspect successfully used the same method to steal the money, according to police. He told the clerk that he would send his sister back in hour an hour with the money, but she never returned.

He is described as white, short black hair combed towards the back, black moustache with one or two days of beard growth. He was wearing a dark leather jacket and a beige sweater. The clerks say he is a "fast and smooth talker" with a heavy Italian accent, according to a police report.

### Theft from auto

Approximately \$500 damage, and \$850 worth of property were stolen from a motor home parked on Guelph St. in Acton sometime between April 12-17, police report. Person(s) unknown entered the vehicle through a skylight, and stole a 14-inch color TV, VCR, 50 assorted country and western cassette tapes and 25 assorted eight-track tapes. Police are still investigating.

## Town could have arena board ads

up benefitting the arena user groups.

"We're looking at it as a package for all three arenas," Shepard said. "We're hoping it will be good for the community because the money raised could help keep expenditures down, which in turn could help keep ice rates down. As well it could allow advertisers to promote their product or service to a select group."

Shepard said if the proposal is

accepted by Council he would like to see the Town have the say as to the positioning of certain ads. Shepard used the example of an ad having a lot of black in it, that if it was in a particular spot it could make it difficult for a goaltender to pick up a puck and possibly increase the chance for injury.

Shepard also said he would like to see the advertising venture be neat in appearance. Shepherd added one idea would be to allow advertising on six feet of each eight-

foot section of board. The extra two feet could be used to border the ad, thus giving it enough room to stand on its own. But Shepard also said something like this would make the advertising much neater in appearance.

The idea of advertising on arena boards is one that at least two area groups have thought about. Last year Acton Junior C Sabres brought the matter up as a fundraising method and recently members of the Georgetown Chrysler Junior B

Raiders executive pondered it over. Shepard said he wasn't aware other groups were thinking of the idea but added by having the Town in charge all user groups will benefit from the proposal instead of a select number.

"This is for the benefit of the whole Town," Shepard said. "The bottom line is the revenue brought in will end up benefitting all the user groups because then we'll be able to use the funds to help keep ice rates down."
