Lifestyle programs get \$25,000 funding

Three short-term, 'healthy lifestyle' programs are to begin immediately in the Halton all three are being entirely financed by the Ontario Ministry of Health and approved by the Halton District Health Council.

H.E.L.P. (Healthy Eating and Lifestyles Project) is sponsored by Halton Roman Catholic School Board and has received \$10,000 in funding.

Directed towards elementary school children, its aim is to heighten awareness of the combined values of fitness and good nutrition. Participating schools operated by the Board will individually create projects designed to improve nutritional habits and fitness: teams of teachers, students and, possibly, parents will work together to develop projects; prizes will be awarded.

Halton Healthy Weight Program is sponsored by Halton Regional Health Department and has received \$5,000 in funding.

Targeted at women in the 20 to 55 age range, the objective is to encourage a positive yet realistic attitude to body size and weight. An eight week mutual aid concept is geared to those women who may be preoccupied with food and body weight and who have been involved in unhealthy
