Missing person

Halton Regional Police are looking for a 13-year-old boy missing from Milton since Monday night. According to police, Christopher Norris is "depressed" and may have been heading for Oakville. He is described as being male, white, approximately 140 cm (4'5"), 35 kilograms (77 pounds) with a very slim build for his age. He has short brown hair, blue eyes and was last seen wearing blue jeans, black running shoes, a white sweat shirt and black baseball cap. Anyone who may have seen the youth is asked to call Det. Sgt. 'Surreptitious' entry

Police are continuing their investigation after a man "surreptitiously entered" the office at a Guelph St. gas station. At about 12:25 p.m. Wednesday the attendant at the station was working outside when the man entered the office, removed about \$200 cash and then "calmly walked" to his car parked on Hall Rd. The suspect is believed to be a male, white approximately 178 cm (5'10") tall, 85 kilograms (188

pounds) with short black hair and a heavy build.

Jewelry stolen

About \$1,500 worth of jewelry and a portable radio was stolen from a Sixth Line residence sometime Monday night. Police believe the culprit entered the house through a sliding basement window. Once inside every room was ransacked and the property was removed.

Fire brief

Halton Hills firefighters were kept busy with a grass fire and a brush fire Wednesday afternoon. At about 3:15 p.m., an Eighth Line property owner was burning some brush and tree trimmings when some burning material flew into a tree. The tree and some nearby brush were ignited but quickly extinguished by Area 2 (Georgetown) firefighters. Approximately five minutes later, Area One (Acton) firefighters were called to extinguish a pair of grass fires near just off Hwy. 7 near the First line. A passing train is believed to have caused the blaze.

Stove fire

Approximately \$2,000 damage was done to a kitchen after a pot caught fire on the stove Friday morning. The pot had boiled dry and caught fire, damaging the exhaust fan and cupboards of the Seventh Conc. home, according to the fire department.

Area man charged with murder

calls and tips from the public about the woman and her missing car, a Guelph OPP spokesperson said.

"We really would like to thank the public for the help they have given us," Const. Charlie Hunter said.

Timothy William Harpur of Erin Township was set to appear in Guelph Provincial court Thursday afternoon charged with first degree murder in connection with the case.

According to police, Harpur — who lives with his parents near Orton — was reported missing on Saturday night.

On Tuesday, an OPP officer spotted a suspicious vehicle on a side road near Kakabeka Falls — west of Thunder Bay — and when he approached the vehicle fled.

The car — a white 1986 Merkur XR4Ti — was stopped after it collided with an unoccupied van and rolled into a ditch.

Police found a set of Ontario licence plates belonging to Bremner in the trunk of the vehicle and seized a .45-calibre handgun.

Harpur was charged with possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of a restricted weapon, dangerous driving and possession of stolen property.

He was remanded on those charges to July 16, 1990 and the first degree murder charge was laid. According to Hunter, police are still investigating the case.
