Deadlocks, give Firestone squad 3-2-3 mark

Hoosiers net pair of league ball ties

After being rained out of the Fergus Softball Tournament on the weekend, the Firestone Halton Hills Hoosiers played in three league games. All of them were "squeakers," with Firestone sandwiching a one-run loss between a pair of ties. This gives Firestone a league record of three wins, three ties and two losses, with just under half of the season under their belt.

The Monday evening game was in Brampton. After a scoreless first inning, the Hoosiers erupted for four runs to take the early lead. Julie Scarlett led off

with a walk. Deanna Louth followed and was hit by a pitch. A Lisa Harlow grounder cashed the lead runner and a Wendy Graham grounder cashed the second runner. Andrea Leeking gained base on an error, setting the stage for Shannon Morris, who bounced a single up the middle to drive in both runners. It was 4-0.

Firestone added another run in the third, when Tracy Hagan tripled to deep right-centre, and Scarlett drove her home with a groundout. Brampton rebounded with three runs in their half of the inning, helped along by two Fire-

stone errors. And the opposition added three more in the fourth inning to take the lead, 6-5.

The Hoosiers chipped away at the lead in the sixth and seventh innings. In the sixth, Louth gained base on an error, was sacrificed into scoring position by Harlow, and driven home by Leeking. An inning later, Kelly Ambrose led off with a walk and stole second. Two outs later, Scarlett singled to score Ambrose and give Firestone the lead, 7-6.

However, the home side scored a single run in their half of the inning, to make the final score 7-7. Leeking played a strong defensive game at catcher throwing out three runners - two to Hagan covering second, and one to Morris at third. Morris and Ambrose split the pitching duties, with Ambrose relieving in the fourth inning and picking up the victory.

Two nights later, the Hoosiers visited the Cawthra Carlies. Firestone fell behind early, 2-0, but got back in it with single runs in the fourth and fifth innings. In the fourth, Sherie Peacock's leadoff double over the left-fielder was converted into a run by Keri Vandevalk's groundout. And an inning later, Denise Hannah singled, moved to second on Leek-

ing's single, and eventually scored on Tammy Richard's sacrifice fly. The score was tied.

The game remained tied until the bottom of the seventh. Helped out by a hit batsman and an error, Cawthra scored an unearned run, to win the game 3-2.

Richard pitched a complete game for Firestone, allowing an earned run on five hits and three walks and two hit batsmen.

Firestone's third game of the week was at home against Burlington. Led by a four-for-four hitting performance by Morris, the home side came away with a 5-5 tie, in a rather sloppy performance which featured several mental and physical errors by both sides.

The Hoosiers opened the scoring in the first with a single run. Amy Cooper singled, took second on an error, and was cashed by a Morris long fly ball to right that the fielder misplayed into a double.

Burlington took the lead 2-1 in the top of the second, helped along by a Firestone error. But the Hoosiers tied it up in the bottom of the inning, when consecutive singles by Ambrose, Peacock and Scarlett produced a run.

Both teams scored two more runs in the next inning. Another two errors by Firestone again helped the opposition. For the home side, Morris singled and Hagan gained base on an error. Ambrose then pounded a double, scoring both runners. The score was knotted at 4-4.

The Hoosiers regained the lead in the fourth, when Vandevalk scored. She gained base on a fielder's choice and was eventually driven in by Leeking's solid single to left. Burlington tied it in the sixth, once again with the help of Firestone misqueues.

The home side nearly pulled it out in the bottom of the seventh. Morris led off with what looked like a sure triple. But the ball rolled under the fence, making it a ground rule-double. Hagen then flied out to deep left, which would have scored the winning run. They then loaded the bases, but couldn't get the winning run.

Ambrose pitched the complete game for Firestone, allowing two earned runs on seven hits and one walk. The Hoosiers pounded out 11 hits, but committed six errors. Defensive gems of the game were a nice running fly ball catch by Cooper, and a run-saving Scarlett to Leeking throw to home.

Exhibition football game
