

Dying is easier the second time around

As for the inundation of countless sequels this year, *Die Hard 2: Die Harder* is by far the best follow-up a blockbuster could ever have, leaving the other summer sequels out in the cold.

And how do you top the first *Die Hard*, where Bruce Willis has to battle international terrorists who seize a Los Angeles skyscraper? Simple. Have Bruce Willis battle international terrorists who seize the entire Washington, D.C. airport.

Willis returns, smart aleck grin intact, as John McClane, the fearless but hopelessly unlucky cop who keeps stumbling into the wrong place at the wrong time. Once again, it's Christmas, this time Washington, D.C., where McClane is waiting for his wife's flight to arrive. Bonnie Bedelia reprises her role as McClane's long-suffering wife/frequent terrorist target.

Minutes before her landing, John happens to notice two foreign gentlemen acting mighty peculiar in the airport lounge. On a hunch, he follows them into a restricted zone and in the process of killing the two criminals, stumbles into one major catastrophe. It turns out the duo were but a small part of a full scale assault on the bustling airport. The elite special forces unit, led by a fanatical former U.S. military officer (William Sadler),

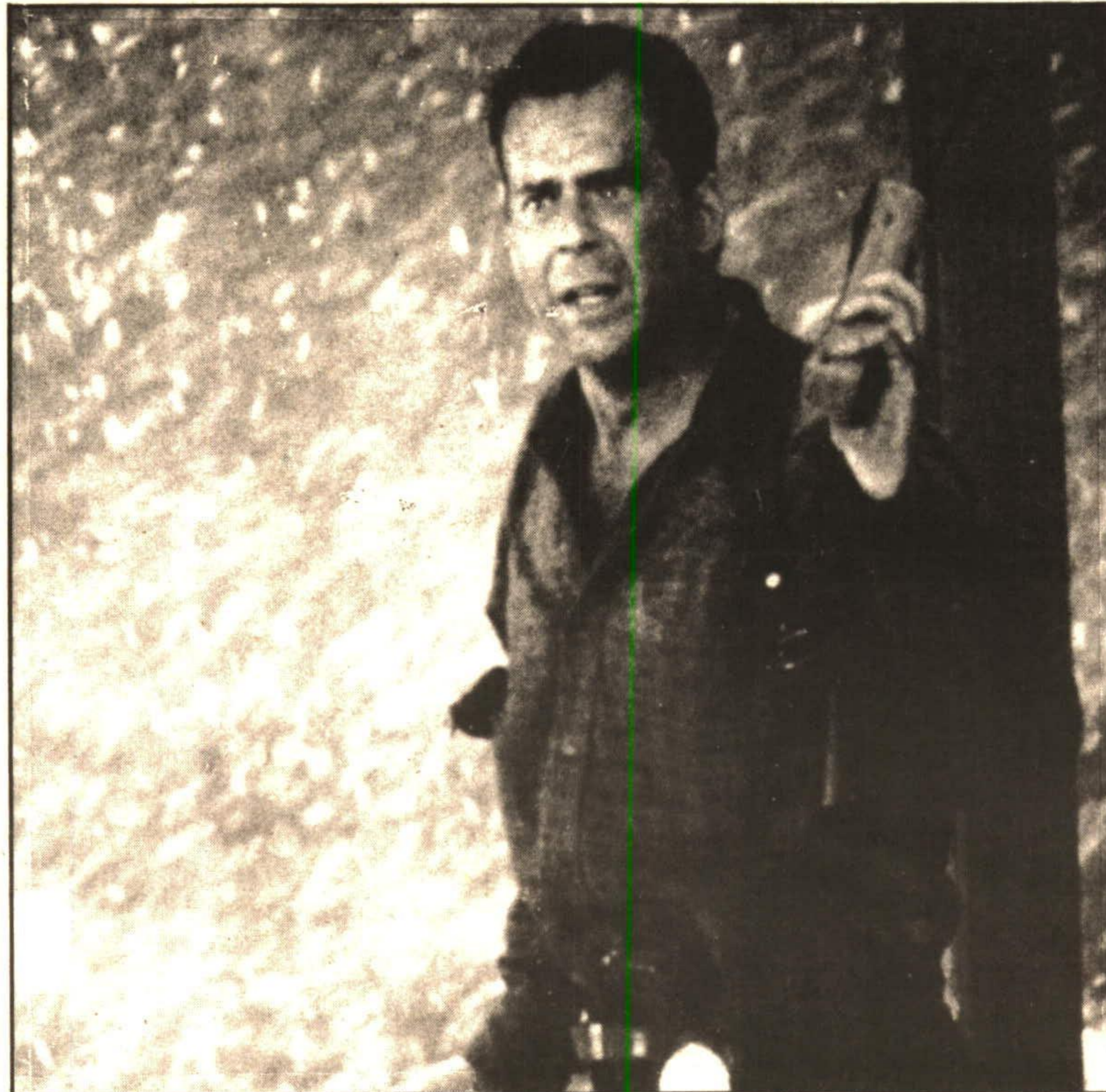
plans to intercept the extradition of a Central American dictator as he's brought into the U.S. for prosecution on drug charges. Their plan is highly ingenious, with mass murder being the somewhat unfortunate part as they keep 13 planes circling the airport in a holding pat-

tern until, one by one, they exhaust their fuel supplies and crash land.

Die Hard 2 is a fantastical, heart-pounding journey into pure excitement. It's IN YOUR FACE action, but clever action, unlike Schwarzenegger's *Total Recall*. This sequel works because it takes the first premise one leap further, exag-

gerating the circumstances and compounding it with breathtaking stunts and state-of-the-art special effects, all the while maintaining a slight tongue-in-cheek flair to the enormous thrill ride. Strap yourself in because *Die Hard 2* is number one with a bullet.

Out of 10, *Die Hard 2* rates a nine.

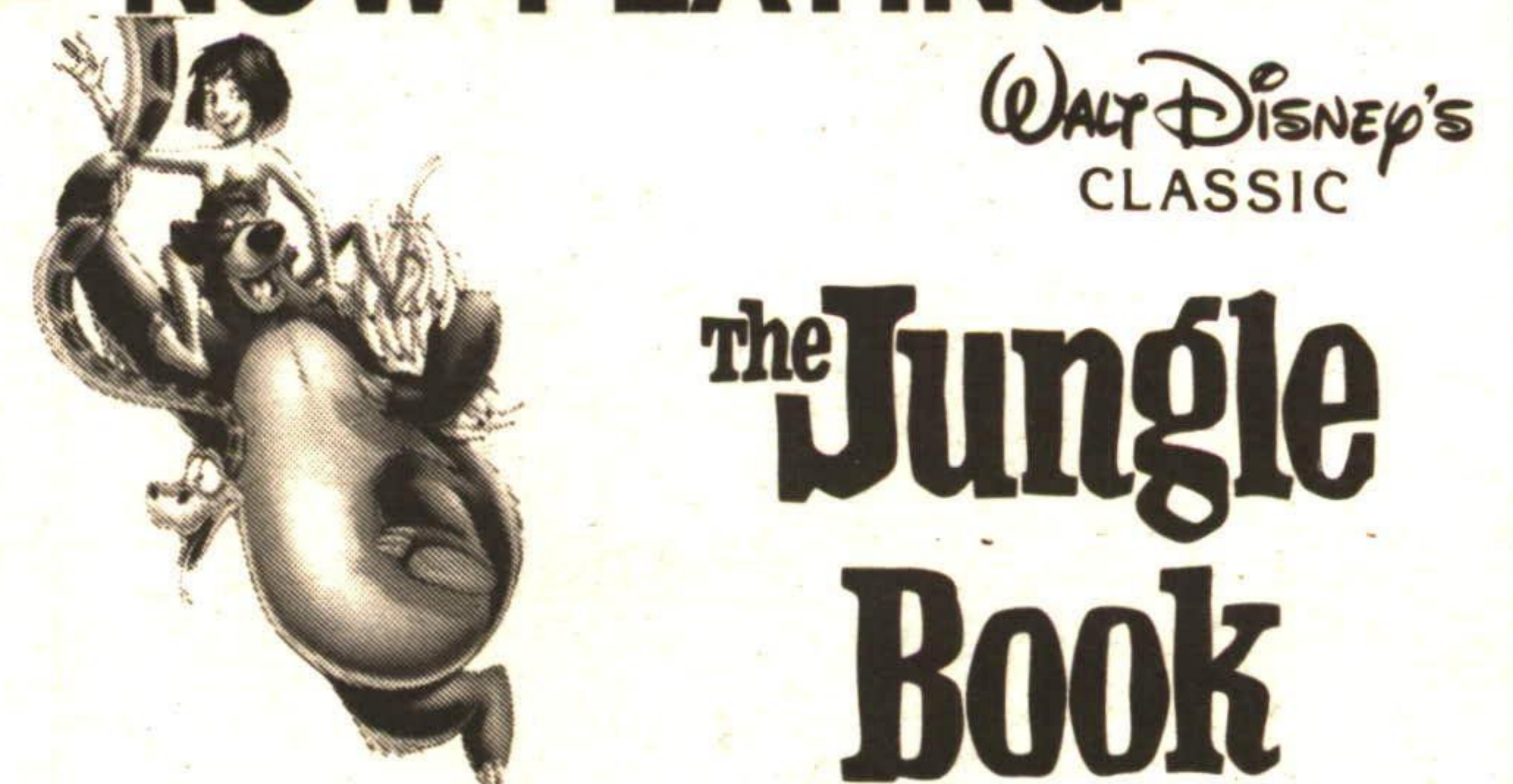
