The right to buy, own and occupy property, to maintain privacy by excluding others from your home, to sell, rent or give away property, to leave it in any condition you wish, to enjoy the goods derived from it, like agricultural

produce, and even the right to destroy your own property if you so desire - these are the "rights" we've come to associates with property ownership.

But most Canadians don't realize there is no guaranteed right to even own private property in Canada. The rights and privileges protected by our Constitution and its Charter of Rights and Freedoms do not include property rights.

Often taken for granted, property rights stand as guidelines for government, but can be overriden by it at any time if the "public good"

We have empowered government to regulate individual rights in the interest of the public wellbe-

Numerous cases across Canada have made it clear that sometimes individuals lose their rights and suffer personal and financial restrictions.


