### ARE YOU AWARE THAT

- Diabetes is the third leading cause of death by disease in Canada.
- Diabetes can cause heart attack, stroke, kidney disease, blindness and amputation.
- Insulin is not a cure. It is simply a control.
- There are over 1 Million diagnosed diabetics in Canada; 540,000 in Ontario.
- By the year 2,000 it is estimated that every family in Canada will be affected by diabetes.
- A baby born in 1989 has better than 1 in 5 chances of becoming diabetic within his/her lifetime.
- Peel Memorial Hospital, Diabetes Education Department, educates 500 diabetics per year. Of that 500 diabetics, approximately 2 per week are gestational diabetics.
- The Canadian Diabetes Association is the major volunteer source of funding for diabetes research in Canada.
