

A roomful of delighted Halton Hills youngsters were recently entertained with an hour's music at Georgetown's John Elliott Theatre by Sandra Beech, a well-known Toronto singer. Beech, sister of Will and George Rogers of the Irish Rovers, performs children's tunes, and has three albums

Silver Creek round-up

Regional councillors were briefed last week on the Oct. 23 public information meeting on twinning the Silver Creek trunk sewer. Though no timing was suggested, staff indicated a recommendation on preferred routing is forthcoming once consultants further explore areas of public concern and complete their Environmental Study Report. Georgetown's former garbage dumps are among those areas of concern. The meeting itself and further studies are expected to cost \$45,000 to \$55,000.

International Water Consultants Ltd. was expected to be hired Wednesday for \$122,800 to monitor water levels around three test wells being established to secure extra water for Georgetown's future growth. The firm will study the areas affected by each well and determine how much water can be taken without disturbing supplies in the vicinity.

Halton has agreed to pay Proctor and Redfern Ltd. up to \$57,315 to decide whether the Huttonville well decommissioned by the City of Brampton can provide extra water for Georgetown. Covering more than half the cost will be developers who stand to gain as the community's population grows to 40,000.

Wellington Construction Ltd. will spend \$514,000 of the Region's money building a water pumping station for the new Tenth Line well (just north of 10 Sdrd., also known as Test Well 21) that will produce more than 1,300 cubic metres a day. The water's iron content earlier forced Halton to spend another \$137,000 on a filter.

The Region will decide at budget time whether it can afford a comprehensive, \$150,000 study of Halton's groundwater resources. Recent years have seen less rain, more water consumption, more complaints about rural wells running dry and more concern about the pace of development, while at the same time it's acknowledged that escarpment quarries are using up a "substantial" amount of water.
