Clergy Comment Don't forget the real meaning of Christmas

It is the season of Advent - a season of preparation. We hustle and bustle about, guided in our every move by our lists. There's the Christmas card list, the gift list, the list of get-togethers, the list of house-cleaning and decorating tasks, the grocery lists, guest lists of who we're expecting ... and the 'list' goes on!

In every encounter, someone asks if we are ready. Of course we're not ready so we tell them which lists are finished and which ones are not. We know about all the lists that help us to prepare.

But what if one of those encounters was with an alien from outer space we were asked to explain our strange behavior? * What is it that you are preparing for? Well - it's kind of a party.

There is special food, special decorations and party favours for all. * But what's the party for? Well - it's a time for family ... it's a festival of lights in the midst of darkness ... it's a time of singing and laughter ... sharing and giving ... it's a time of peace and love.

* That tells me what the party is like! But what is it for? It's a birthday party!

* Then who is it for? It's for Jesus.

* And what's so special about this Jesus? Well - he was born in a stable in Bethlehem many years ago and in everything in his life he showed us the power of love and forgiveness.

* And so he's the guest of honor? Well - sort of ...

* What do you mean - sort of? YOU ARE GOING TO INVITE HIM - AREN'T YOU?

The glory of God is His manifested presence

The manifestation of God's presence and power is the 'glory of God'. Jesus' prayer to the Father for all believers is, "I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one" (1). The presence and power of God unites believers in love, making them of one mind and one spirit.

To come near the Ark of the Covenant in Old Testament days was to experience the presence, power, and glory of God. It had to be handled with special care it" (4). because it was so holy. The Ark contained the law, some manna, and the rod of Aaron (2).

The stone tablets containing the 10 Commandments represented Father God, the manna Jesus as our Bread (3), the rod of Aaron the power of the Holy Spirit. These three articles are symbols of the Godhead living within every born-again believer, "in Christ you too are filled with the Godhead - Father, Son, and Holy Spir-

To understand that we Christians each have the life and power of God within us eliminates all fear of anything the world can throw at us. Not only is God inside us, He is also above us (5), under us (6), on our right hand (7), and on our left hand (8). He is behind us to deal with our past (9), and ahead of us to deal with our future (10). He is in us, and we are in Him (11).

To be touched with God's pres-

ence and power is called 'anointing'. New kings were anointed with oil in the Old Testament; a born-again Christian is anointed with the oil of the Holy Spirit. We are "kings and priests: (12) - kings anointed with His Spirit, and priests to minister unto Him!

To receive His anointing, we must repent and ask Jesus to live within us. When His Spirit has been birthed within us, we are eligible to pray for a further anointing of His Holy Spirit. Even though we have had both of these experiences, we must free our- 6:35 selves from sin to maintain the anointing, a sign of His presence.

As we clean up the kingdom of our hearts so that Jesus can reign there, we become clearer channels through which His anointing -His presence, power, and glory, can be manifested.

Not only is there a revival of evil in our day, there is also a revival of Christianity. Along with manifestations of evil powers,
