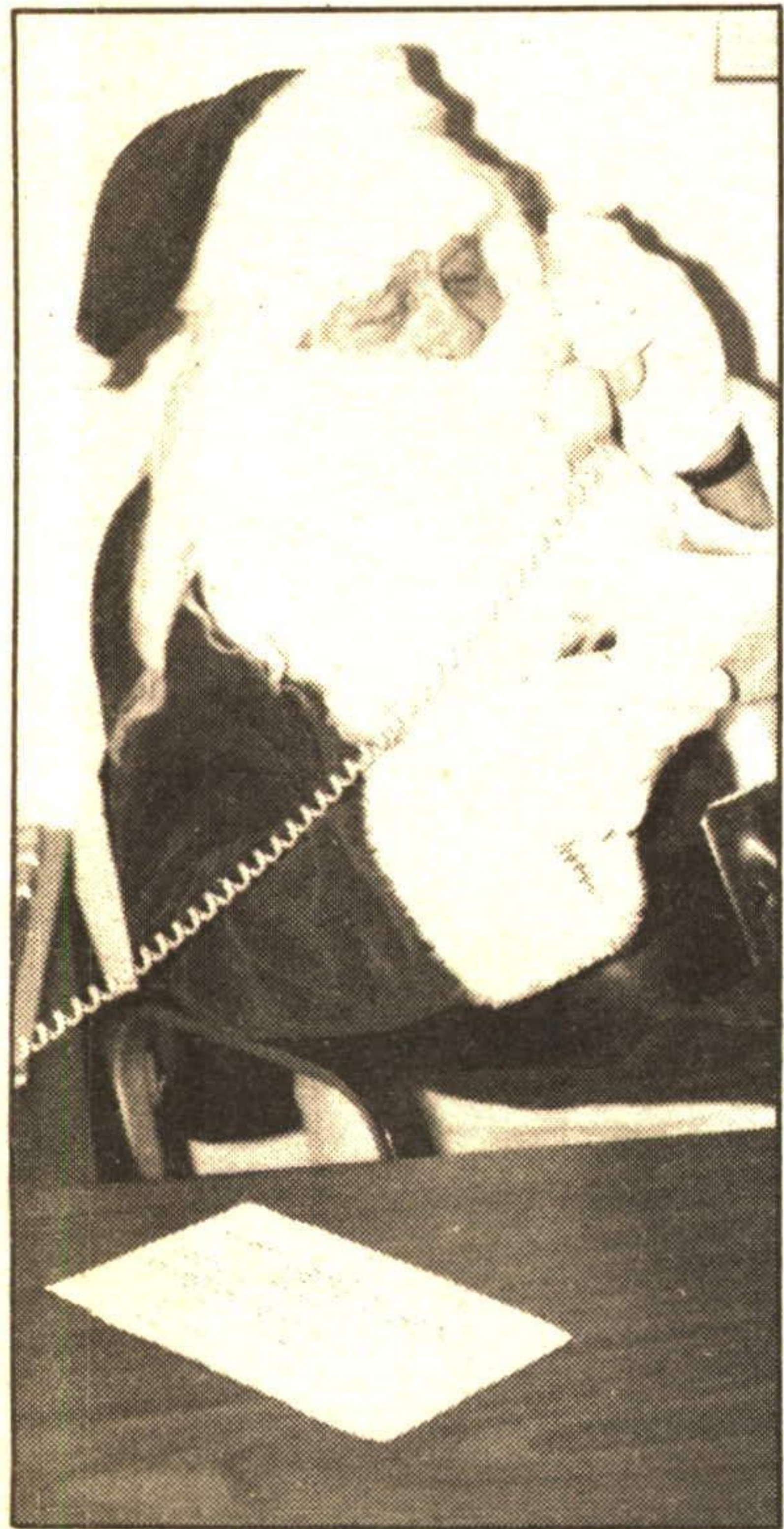

Salvation Army Captain Wade Budgell said donations of toys are very good this year, and each child will get two toys. Food donations have also drifted in steadily, but money donations have been low.
