'Not consistent with good planning'

The hopes of Norval's Willow Park residents of relocating their trailer homes to Nor-Halton Park near Acton have been dashed by the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB).

OMB members Jim Mills and Peter Wilkes ruled last week that Nor-Halton owner Merv Barber cannot amend the Official Plan to accommodate 30 permanent "mobile" homes on approximately 10 acres of his 62-acre parcel.

"The Board is not persuaded by...evidence that the kinds of buffering measures proposed would overcome the very real planning concerns which have been identified by the neighbors," Wilkes wrote in his decision. "Having considered all of the evidence the Board has concluded that the amendments before it are not consistent with good planning principles."

The Town of Halton Hills originally approved the amendment and a zoning bylaw in August, 1989, but neighboring residents expressed their opposition to

A G.T. Snow Racer worth about \$40 was removed from the front of a Rosetta St., Georgetown residence Sunday.

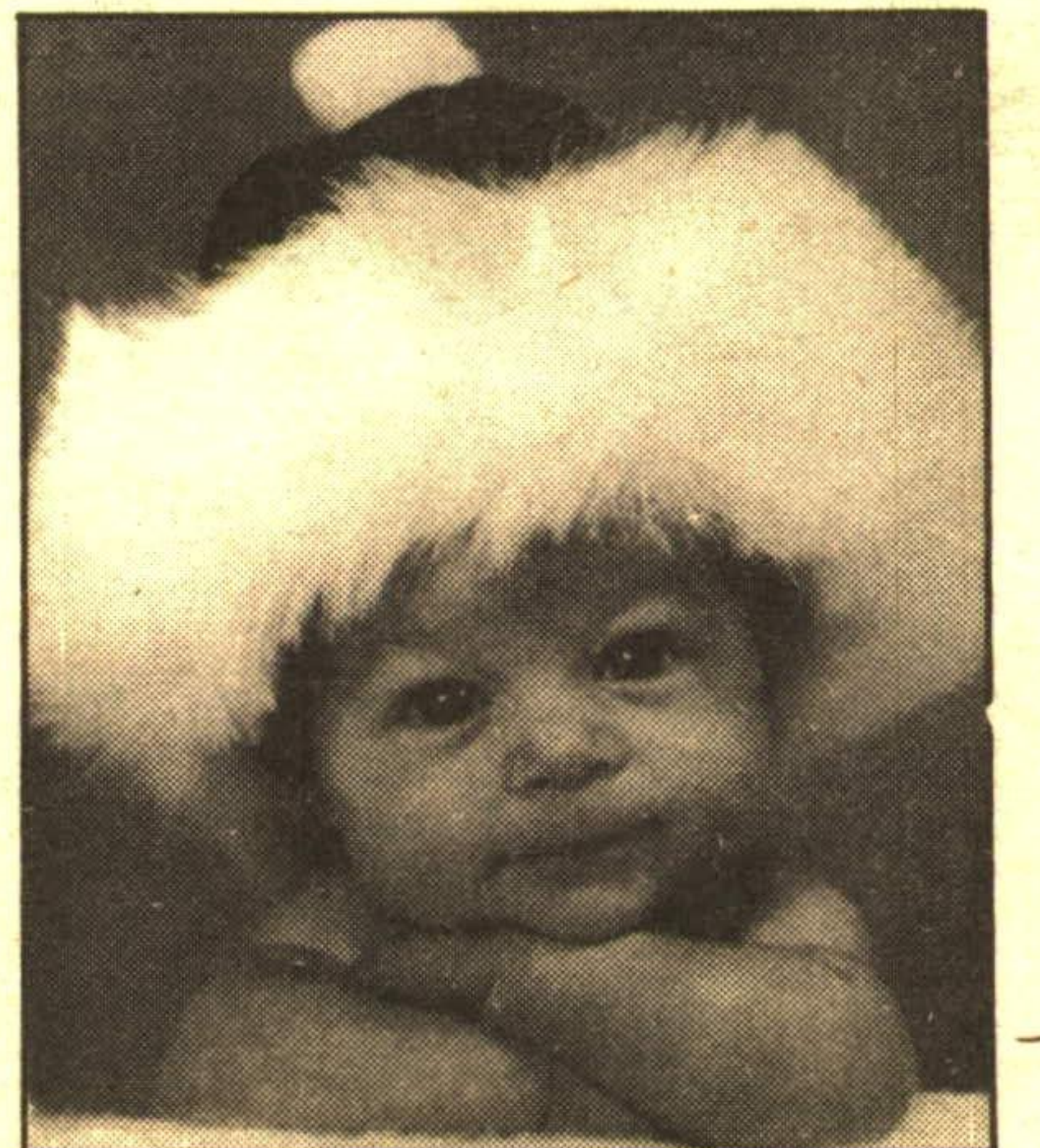
No damage
