## Local teams set to do battle

The future of junior hockey in Ontario will invade Georgetown next week as 20 of the top midget teams from the area, as far away as Quebec, invade Georgetown for the 24th Annual Georgetown Midget Hockey Tournament.

Three local teams will participate in the two division event, with the host Georgetown Sunny Acre Farm Midgets and Acton Travel Midgets competing for AA honors. The Halton Hurricanes will fight for the AAA honors. The event gets under way on Wednesday, Jan. 2 and winds up with the championship tilts on Sunday, Jan. 6.

A total of eight teams, in two four team divisions will compete for the AAA title. The Toronto Red Wings, Mississauga North Stars, Sault Ste. Marie

Elks and Whitby will make up one division while the Halton Hurricanes, Barrie, Mississauga Black Hawks and Richmond Hill Vaughan Kings will battle in the other division.

In the AA pool there are three divisions with four teams in each. Kitchener, Royal York, Sudbury and the Quebec Citadels make up one loop while Ajax, Brampton, Waterloo and the Mississauga Terriers complete another. The two Halton Hills entries, Georgetown and Acton, hook up with Port Perry and Streetsville.

The top two teams in the AAA divisions will advance to Sunday's semi-finals while the top team in each AA division, plus a wildcard entry will battle for their division title.

## 'Same old story' plagues Raiders

It was "the same old story" for the Georgetown Chrysler Raiders when they faced off against Burlington Cougars last Saturday.

Despite a strong effort in the first two periods of the Junior B game at Gordon Alcott Arena, the local squad struggled in the third eventually losing 5-1.

Junior B West Division All Star Rob Doucette was the Raiders lone goal scorer in the game.

"The game was a lot closer than the score would indicate," General Manager Joe Walsh said.

The Raiders stayed with the Cougars throughout the first two periods, closing out the second frame 2-0 behind Burlington.

But a pair of quick Cougar goals opened the third period and the Raiders were faced "with the same let down" that has plagued them

throughout the Junior B season — losing tough games in the third period.

"We had some chances, but Burlington's goaltending was good and we hit some posts," Walsh said. "We have to finish off our scoring drives."

In a pair of home games the Raiders hosted Streetsville Derbys last night and Oakville Blades today.

The Raiders have a 2-3 record against the Derbys but have not won against Oakville this season.

"The last game against Oakville we stayed with them through two periods," Walsh said. "It would be nice to finish off the year with a couple of wins."

The Raiders are currently in sixth place in Central Junior B action with 18 points and a 9-19 record.

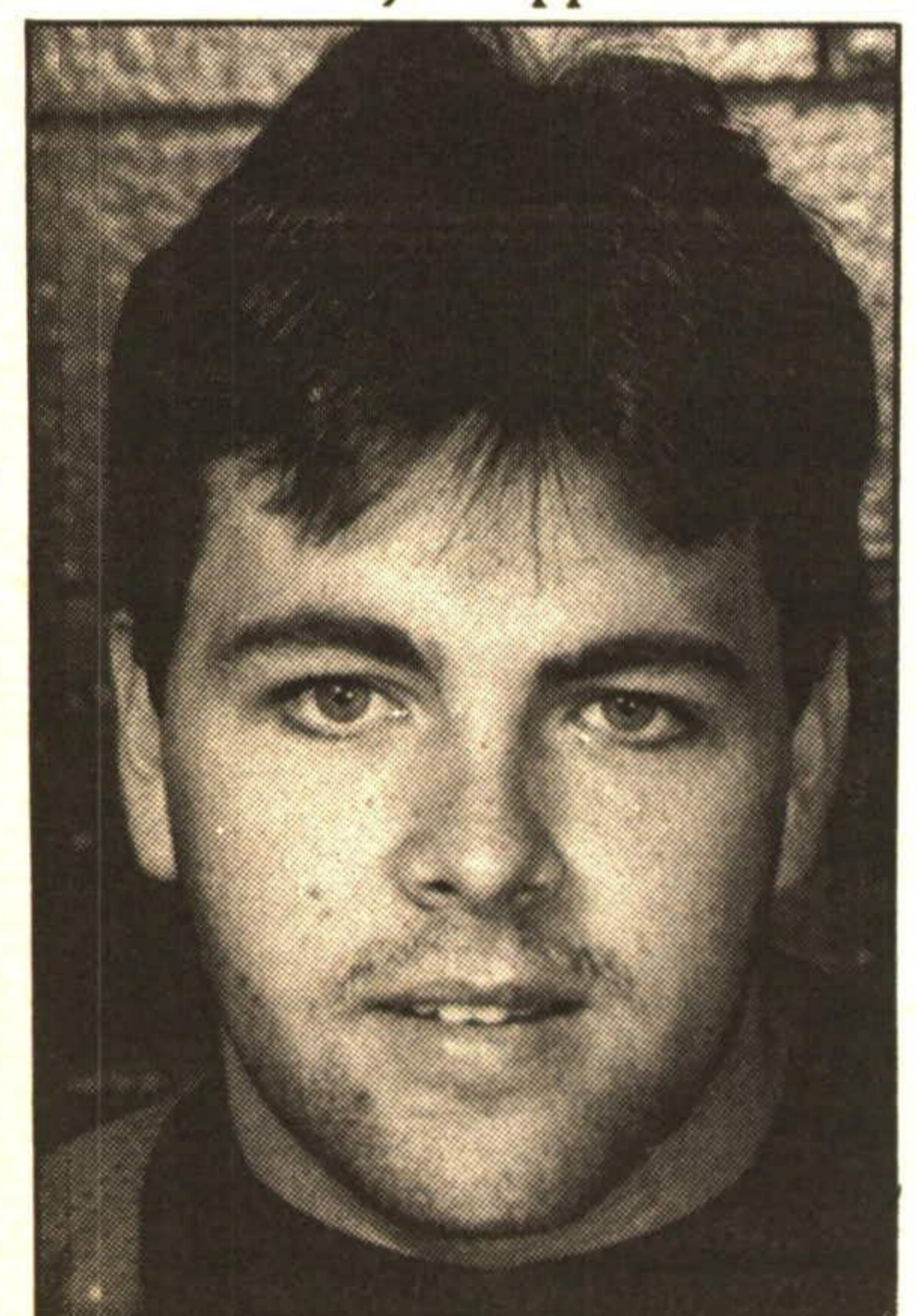

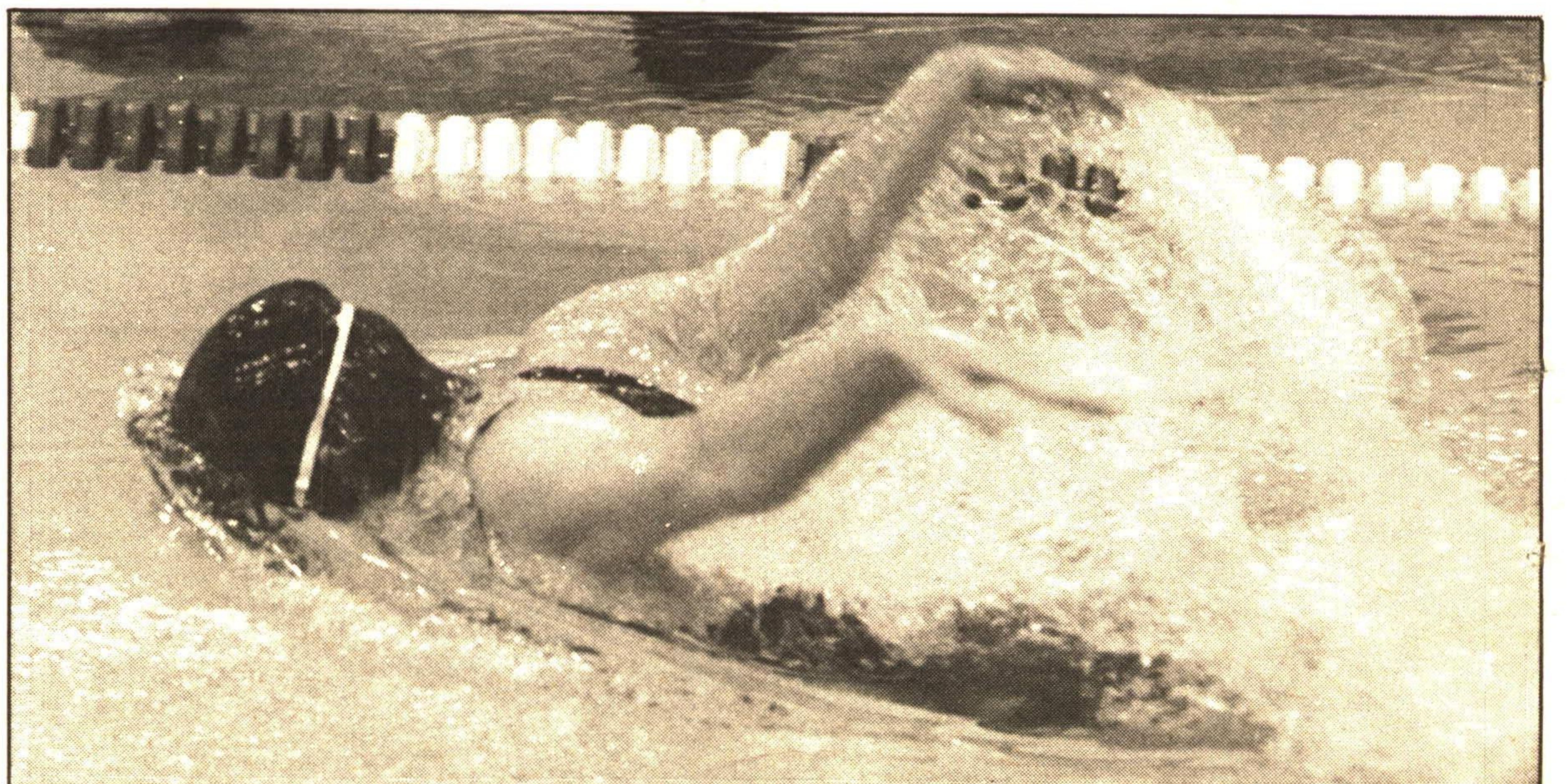
across the Central Junior B West division to battle the East Division at the league's All-Star Game January 13 in Streetsville.
