he could send terrorists here to hurt people in our cities too."

To Mary Ann, the television coverage is nothing more than a "bunch of maps on TV, and some reporters talking muffled through their gas masks." She is well informed on how a SCUD missile can spew nerve gas over an area, and hopes it doesn't affect the ozone layer, if Hussein fires one.

"But I don't think he'll come over here," says Mary Ann confidently, "We have nothing he wants to take."

That is reassuring.

Maggie will soon be 10 years old. To her, the worst thing about this war is Saddam dropping missiles on the Israelis.

"It just isn't fair," says Maggie, "after all, they didn't do anything wrong, and now they have to run around wearing gas masks, and watching out for missiles. That's sick!"

"Why doesn't he (Saddam) leave them alone. They don't want to fight, and now he's hurting them just because of their religion."

When asked if Israel should retaliate, Maggie had to give that one some thought. "If they do, they'll upset the countries around them," she replied, " and the war could get bigger. But I think they can only have their houses blown up a few more times before they get really mad and send back some bombs. At least no one's been killed." After a bit she added, "I think it's kind of them to not fight back."

Our kids are better informed than we give them credit for.

Maggie doesn't think we have much to worry about in Halton Hills. She just doesn't think the fighting will get quite that far. And if it does, "the grownups will have to worry about that."

She say TV coverage is "just fuzzy pictures that come to us by satellite," and the graphics showing the attacks "look like cartoons or video games." And those reporters and soldiers "are all standing around with gas masks on their belts."

## Erin Soaring Society prepares for spring


