In a hearing Wednesday, Provincial Court Judge Douglas Latimer learned the weapons — 35 Heckler and Kosh MP5-A3 rifles - were shipped to a Limehouse firm last January.

In what could be a precedent setting decision, Judge Latimer will have to determine whether or not Door broken the weapons should have been allowed in the country in the first place.

"The only issue this court has to decide is whether or not these firearms are prohibited weapons or simply restricted because of the barrel length," Morton Greenglass, the Limehouse firm's lawyer said.


According to Crown evidence presented in Milton court Wednesday, a relatively simple conversion can make the weapons capable of firing in a fully automatic mode.

According to the Criminal Code of Canada, fully automatic weapons — those capable of firing more than one bullet with each depression of the trigger - are il-

Originally manufactured as fully automatic weapons, the MI 5s shipped to Collector's Source were converted to semi-automatic weapons.

But the man who actually shipped the weapons to Canada a British firearms distributor — said the conversion is very dangerous and not easily performed. "You have got to know what to do (to perform the conversion)," Anthony Hallan, the owner of Charnwood Ordanace in England, said. "We tried to convert one and smashed the grip."

The hearing will continue later this month and a decision on the fate of the weapons — which could be ordered destroyed — is expected shortly after.


