**Albert Brooks began holstein herd at age 11**

Long time Limehouse dairy farmer Albert Brooks died at Georgetown District Memorial Hospital on Jan. 11, at the age of 81.

Mr. Brooks, an avid writer of true life stories and poetry came to Canada in 1911 making Toronto his home. He called Halton Hills home for 70 years. He began his family holstein herd at the age 11, after receiving a medal for displaying a calf.

He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Winnifred Grace, and children John Brown of Georgetown, Rosemary Farnsworth of Limehouse, Ronna Taylor of Cambridge, Roy Brooks of Acton, Sue Bosch of Guelph and Barry Brooks of Limehouse. He is also survived by a brother, Fred Brooks, of Limehouse and 13 grandchildren. He is predeceased by brother William Brooks of Hast-

ings and sister Agnes Porte of Acton.

Funeral services were held at Shoemaker Funeral Home Jan. 14 with Rev. Andrew Asbil officiating. Interment was at Fairview Cemetery. Pallbearers included nephews Joe Brooks, Bill Brooks, and son-in-laws Vince Farnsworth, Neil Taylor, Roy Bosch, and Norm Graham.

**ICE fund-raiser**

A north Halton environmental group and a Georgetown artist have teamed up for a unique fund-raising scheme.

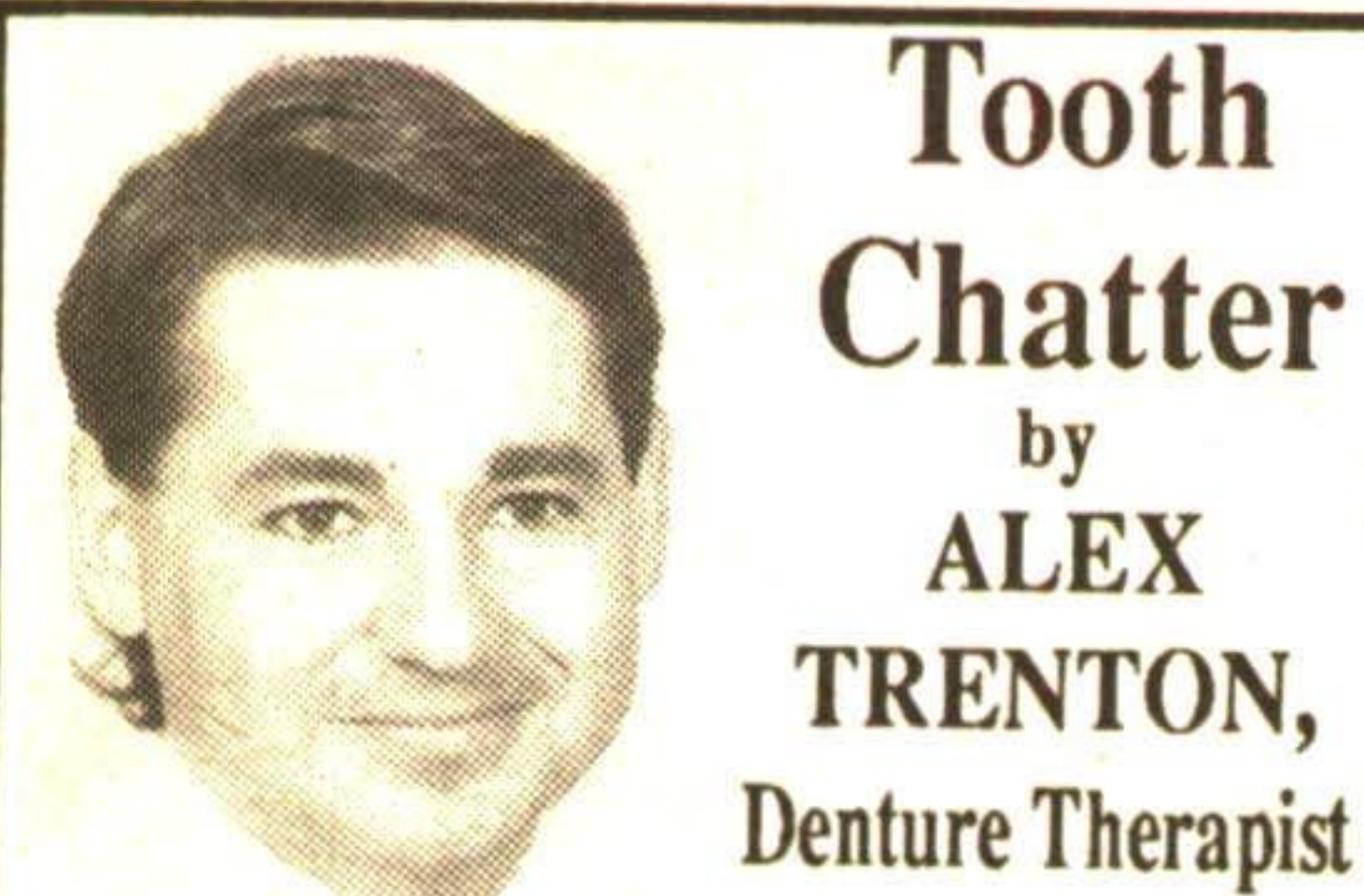

**NEW HOPE FOR LOWER DENTURES**

Do you have trouble with your lower dentures? Does it move from side to side, or fly out of your mouth when you cough or sneeze? So you have a flat lower ridge? They are small wing-like loop inserts, that are placed on the inside flange of the denture, where your tongue rests. It is completely unnoticeable in the mouth, as it is covered by the tongue. The tongue actually helps hold the denture in place as it rests on the wings.

This system can be inserted in the new dentures, or can also be placed in existing dentures, in the same length of time as it takes to do a simple repair. The cost of the insert is about the same as a standard relin.

Thousands of people across the country are already wearing dentures with the Myoloc Wing System. These people report greatly increased comfort, when compared to dentures without the insert. 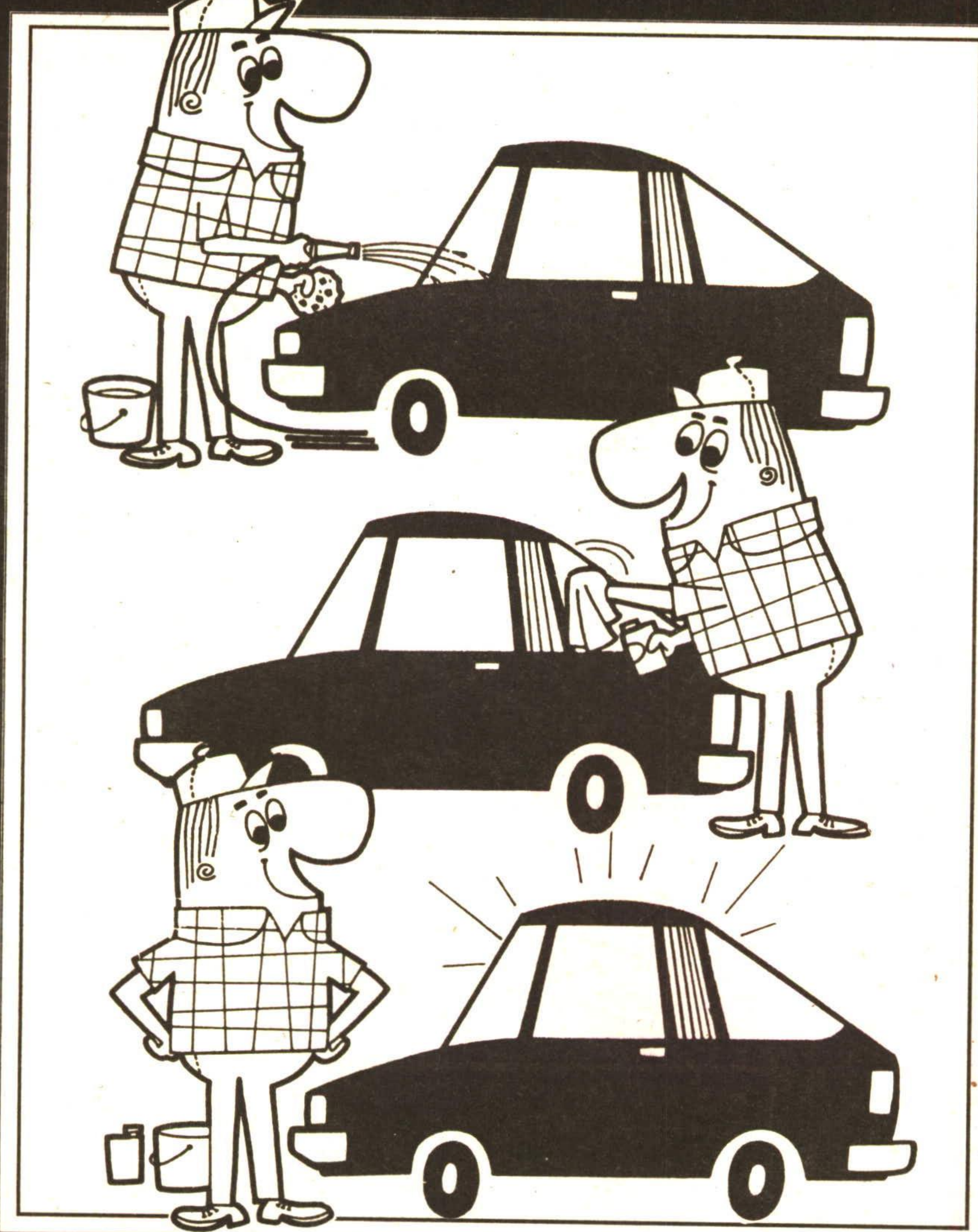
