

Area DJs harmonize

Putting a new spin on a familiar tune, area disc jockeys have united to boost their industry's credibility, ensure customers are satisfied and keep an eye on illegal DJs.

Costs more to enter conservation areas

As of February 1, the Halton Region Conservation Authority is initiating new rates for its conservation areas. The new rates include the seven per cent GST tax that was implemented by the federal government on January 1. They also reflect higher operating and maintenance costs for providing services and facilities.

For many years, the Authority has charged by the vehicle. This made entry fees quite modest for a van with seven people but more expensive for a vehicle with only one or two people. The new rates, based on a per person fee, is a fairer method that directly relates to individual user visits, the Authority maintains.

The new rates include: \$2.50 each for adults; \$2 each for students (13 and over) and \$1.50 for children (12 and under) with no charge for pre-school children. The fee for senior citizens, 65 and over, is \$1.50 each.

Another wrinkle with the new rate system - your cash register receipt, which replaces the old entry tickets, can be used to access any other areas operated by the Halton Authority on the same day.

The new rates are the same at each of the five primary conservation areas operated by the Conservation Authority, thus eliminating previous rate differences from area to area.

The best option for regular conservation area visitors is the annual season pass for vehicles at \$60. The pass offers unlimited use of Mountsberg, Crawford Lake, Rattlesnake Point, Hilton Falls and Kelso Conservation Areas.

Starting this year, all season pass purchasers will receive a free subscription to the Conservation Authority's newsletter, the Conservation Cornerstone. The quarterly publication includes a calendar of special events along with interesting items on conservation and the environment.


The revenue from park entry fees is used to offset conservation area expenditures.


