

Georgetown gymnast Angela Stiles held onto her second place national ranking at a competition in Bramalea last Sunday.

Despite gold medal performaces on the beam and floor, Stiles, 12, finished a tenth of a point behind all-round winner Teresa Wolf.


"Her vault was just not up to par and that hurt her," Stiles' coach Barbara Fraser said.

Stiles came away with a 9.35 on floor, 9.4 on beam, 9.05 on uneven parallel bars - good for fourth place — and 8.8 on vault.
