# Derbys, flu virus both bug Raiders

A flu bug riddled the ranks of the Georgetown Chrysler Raiders before the squad took to the ice and was riddled again, this time by the Streetsville Derbys.

Five players — including starting goalie Jason Sirota, who was pulled in the middle of the opening period — were afflicted before the game started Tuesday night.

Marty Savoy, Mike Wilson, Brian Cormack and Scott Humber all struggled through the game because of the bug, said Finn Poulstrup, Raiders president and general manager.

The Central Junior B team struggled to a 10-4 loss in Streetsville.

"We had 18 guys on the roster, two of them are goalies leaving us with 16. When four of the 16 are sick, it's pretty tough to play," he added. "This was not a typical game for us."

Streetsville opened the scoring just 40 seconds into the game, and went up by two goals slightly more than two minutes later.

The Raiders got on the board just inside the eight minute mark of the opening frame when Humber — despite being ill — took a pass from Adam Hagen and Charlie Humber.

Streetsville stretched their lead

to 3-1 — and drove Sirota from the game — before Bill McDonald, Hagen and Corey Ames combined to give Georgetown their second goal on the night at the 13:35 mark of the first period.

But the Derbys closed the first period with another goal, giving them a 4-2 lead at the first break.

The Raiders were unable to score in the second period, while Streetsville netted another pair.

Hagen opened the third period scoring on a powerplay combination with Duane Lewis and Matt Rudniki.

Lewis was later forced out of the game with an ankle injury, but Poulstrup said he hoped the sharpshooter would be back for the team's final two regular season games.

Meanwhile, a pair of Streetsville goals put the game out of reach for the locals.

McDonald netted his second on the night — the Raider's last — after taking a pass from John Ventresca.

Streetsville scored the final goal of the game with just 55 seconds left to bring the score to 10-4.

The Raiders travelled to Oakville last night (Friday) and host the Peterborough Petes for their final regular season game tonight.

## Midgets come up short in OMHA playoff drive

The Ontario Minor Hockey Association playoff drive was expected to be a long one for the Acton Travel Midgets this season, but it ran out of gas before it really started.

The local team finished atop the Hub League standings, but couldn't get by Fergus in the opening round of playoffs, dropping a 4-2 overtime decision in the fifth and deciding game of the best of five set.

Fergus claimed two overtime wins and a 5-4 decision in the series, while Acton took games two and three by identical 4-3 scores.

After losing the opening encounter 6-4 in extra time, the Travellers rebounded with back to back 4-3 wins to assume control of the series, but Fergus was not to be denied. They won 5-4 Monday and 4-2 in overtime Tuesday to win the series.

In game two, a 4-3 Acton win, the Travellers got goals from Mike Kinnon, John MacLean, Rob Richmond

and Jeff Koprowski. Jason Piper picked up three assists while Wayne Bousfield helped on two.

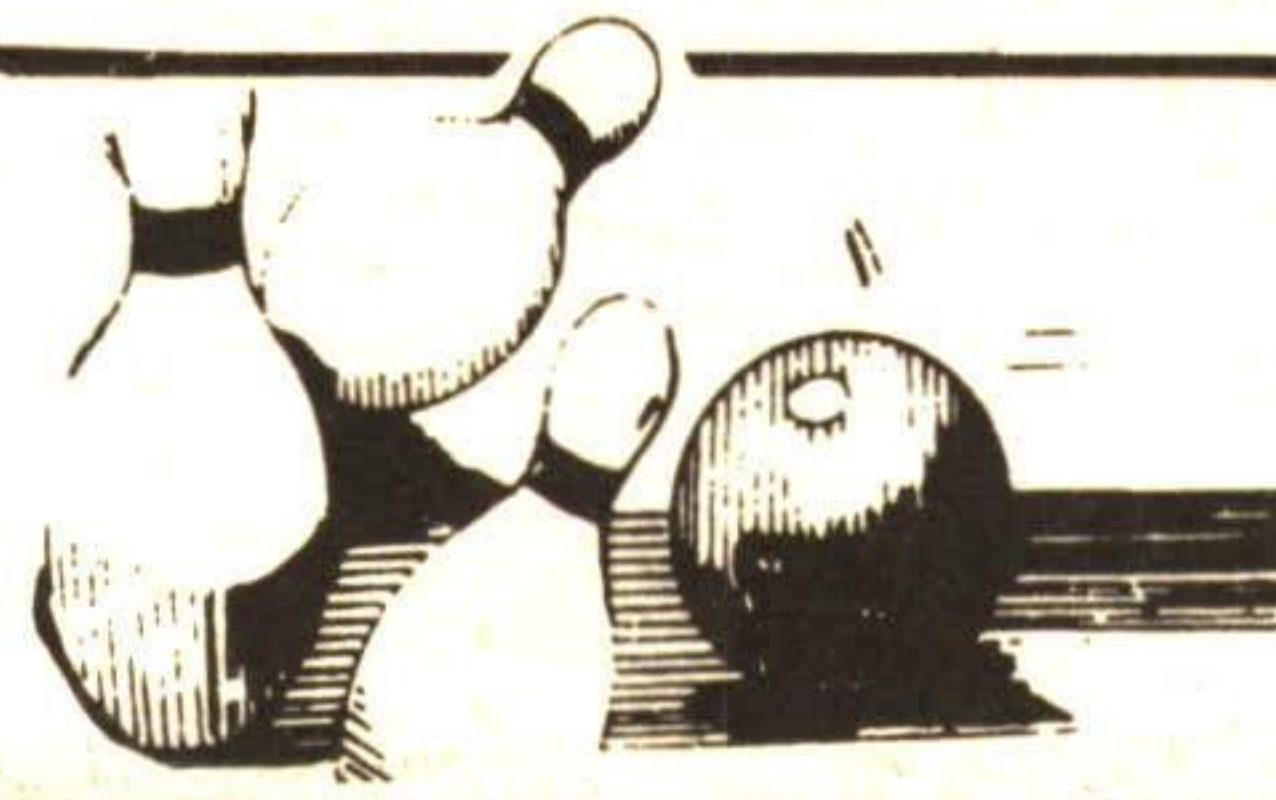
The next match, also a 4-3 Acton win, Jason McNaught netted a couple while Bousfield and Koprowski scored one each. Piper picked up two more assists.
