



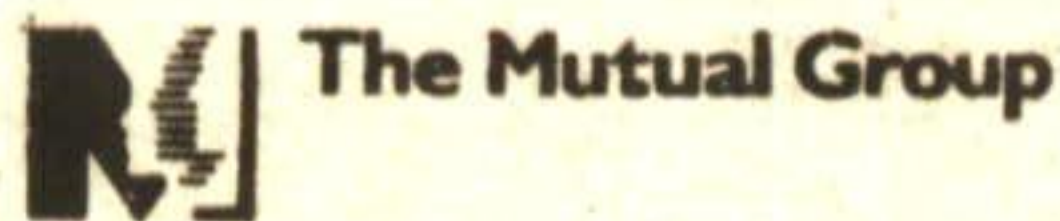

GREEN THUMB GARDENING

JUNGLE OF JARGON

Some times the terminology associated with gardening can be a dense jungle of jargon. The following is a short list of common plant terms and their meanings to help you prepare for the upcoming gardening season:

Annual: Refers to the group of plants that grow, flower and then die within a year. In this area we plant them in mid May when all danger of frost is past. Common examples include: Marigolds, Petunias, Alyssum, Impatiens, etc.

Biennial: Similar to the annual plants except these plants require two seasons to complete their lifecycle. They usually flower during the second season. Popular biennials are: Foxglove, Canterbury Bells and Hollyhocks.

Bolt: During the long days of summer some vegetables quickly develop a tall flowering stem. Broccoli and lettuce frequently go through this process of bolting.

Chlorophyll: Is the green substance found in plants. It is important in the conversion of light and other elements into a food source for the plant.

Chlorosis: A yellowing of normally green leaves. This can occur because of a nutritional imbalance or the development of a disease.

Cotyledon: Is the first green leaf-like structures that form after a seed germinates and starts to grow. These are not true leaves.

Dormancy: A state of suspended inactivity. Seeds and outdoor plants in the winter are in this low activity period.

Hardening Off: A process to move plants from an indoor location to a harsher environment outside for the summer. Over a period of two weeks the plants are set outside during the day and brought back indoors a night. When all danger of frost is past the plants can be put in the ground.

Node: A small area on a plants stem that is slightly swollen. This is where leaves, branches and some flowers originate.
