





Halton residents urged to take part in review

On January 25, 1991, a series of advertisements in Halton papers invited the public to participate in the review of Regional government in Halton.

This is the first major review of the Regional government since its establishment in 1974. "We are not re-visiting the question of whether there should be Regional government in Halton; that decision was made in 1974," said Councillor Joyce Savoline, chairman of the Regional Review Committee. "We are re-examining matters, such as how the Regional Chairman is elected and whether the number and distribution of Council seats provides fair and adequate representation throughout Halton."

Halton residents can provide input to the review process in a couple of ways. A Regional review questionnaire is available and written submissions to the committee are also welcome.

The questionnaire focuses on three major topics. Regional Council is the subject of the first section, with questions addressing the size and composition of Council and the distribution of seats within the Region. The second section concerns the position of the Regional Chairman, particularly the options for electing the Chairman. The final series of questions relates to the role and responsibilities of the Regional Councillors.

"The questionnaire is brief, only 13 questions, with enough space for additional comments," said Savoline. Public input will be considered along with other sources of information as the Committee considers the issues.

The second phase of the Regional Review process will concentrate on the distribution of responsibilities between the area municipalities and the Region. Although the questionnaire does not address this issue, comments are welcomed on this topic also.

Written submissions and/or questionnaires should be received by March 1, 1991 in order for the Committee to complete the first phase of its review by the end of June.
