## Silence of the Lambs rates a nine

Definitely the best thriller to hit movie screens in a long time, The Silence Of The Lambs is a gripping, equally terrifying journey into the dark recesses of the human mind that'll leave you faint with fear.

Jodie Foster plays Clarice Starling, a young FBI trainee sent to the front of the lines by FBI Agent Jack Crawford (Scott Glenn) in order to track down a serial killer known as "Buffalo Bill." To worm her way into the killer's mind and calculate his next move, Clarice has to confront the sociopathic but extremely shrewd Dr. Hannibal "the Cannibal" Lecter (Anthony Hopkins), the only mind perverse enough to outsmart the twisted slayer.

But to associate with the evil Doctor means Clarice must risk her life and sustain her mental stability as Lecter skilfully delves into her subconscious and targets her weaknesses for his own sick gratification.

The Silence Of The Lambs was screened the day after Sleeping With The Enemy and these two women-as-victim films are like

night and day. Sleeping With The Enemy was extremely unimaginative and predictable - a real low-level IQ film.

By contrast, Silence Of The Lambs, directed by Johnathan Demme, is an intelligent, brilliantly crafted psychological thriller that always remains one step ahead of the audience - something which most other films of this genre never achieve.

Jodie Foster gives a terrific performance, full of depth and real strength. Anthony Hopkins is absolutely superb, a spine-tin-


