

Barrie takes wind out of Hurricanes

The Halton Hurricanes Canada Brick "AAA" Major Midgets ended their 36 game regular season schedule last week with a 21-9-6 record and a solid second place finish.

Barrie, the clear powerhouse of the seven team league, earned 62 of a possible 72 points to secure top spot, while Burlington finished with 38 points, 10 behind the Hurricanes, in third position.

The best of five OMHA qualifier series between the top two teams opened in Barrie with a 3-0 shutout of the Hurricanes. The play was closer than the score suggests, but Halton's forwards lacked some breaks around the Barrie net. Goalie Ryan Peddie played a particularly solid game for the Hurricanes, despite the loss.

Game two played at Memorial arena in Milton, was a classic high-scoring playoff encounter. Barrie opened the scoring in the first minute of play, but Halton's Trevor Elinesky quickly equalized with a low shot from the right point, after a set-up by Patrick Hennerberry and Wade Burrows.

Elinesky struck again, two minutes later following some great forechecking by Halton. The lead was short-lived, however, as Barrie equalized with 2:09 on the clock, then jumped to a 3-2 lead on the power play with 14 seconds remaining in the first period.

The Hurricanes again equalized, early in the second, when Ken Kosziwka assisted by Mike McPhail and Jake Mashinter scored a wrap-around goal.

Play remained tied at 3-3 until 40 seconds into the final frame when Mike Cox buried the rebound from another Elinesky shot.

The see-saw action continued, as Barrie equalized three minutes later, then Halton again took the lead when defenceman Dave Osborne skated around two Barrie defenders and drilled home a wrist shot.

With 1:36 remaining in regulation play, Halton's worst fears were realized when Barrie again tied the proceedings and sent the game into overtime.

Elinesky opened the overtime scoring with his hat trick, converting the rebound from Rob Laing's point shot. Another Laing point shot, 40 seconds later, put the Hurricanes into a seemingly safe 7-5 lead, but a late Barrie power play goal cut the lead to 7-6, and with 1:37 remaining, Barrie added their seventh goal to split the decision.

Back in Barrie for game three, it turned into an 8-1 scoring spree for Barrie against an injury depleted Hurricane squad. Rob Crowe, assisted by Hennerberry, scored Halton's lone marker in the second period.

On Friday in Georgetown, Halton re-grouped and again forced overtime in an end to end fourth game.

After a scoreless first period, Barrie scored on the power play early in the second, then Kosziwka equalized from Damien Dubien and Laing. Barrie again went ahead in the third, and with three minutes remaining, Todd Mulley tied the score at 2-2, from Joe Piazza and Osborne.

The Hurricanes needed a victory to keep the series alive, and with goalie Peddie on the bench, Barrie capitalized on the open net to take the overtime win and advance to the playoffs.

Select hockey teams from Acton and Georgetown Atom House Leagues met in an exciting exhibition game in Acton Sunday night.

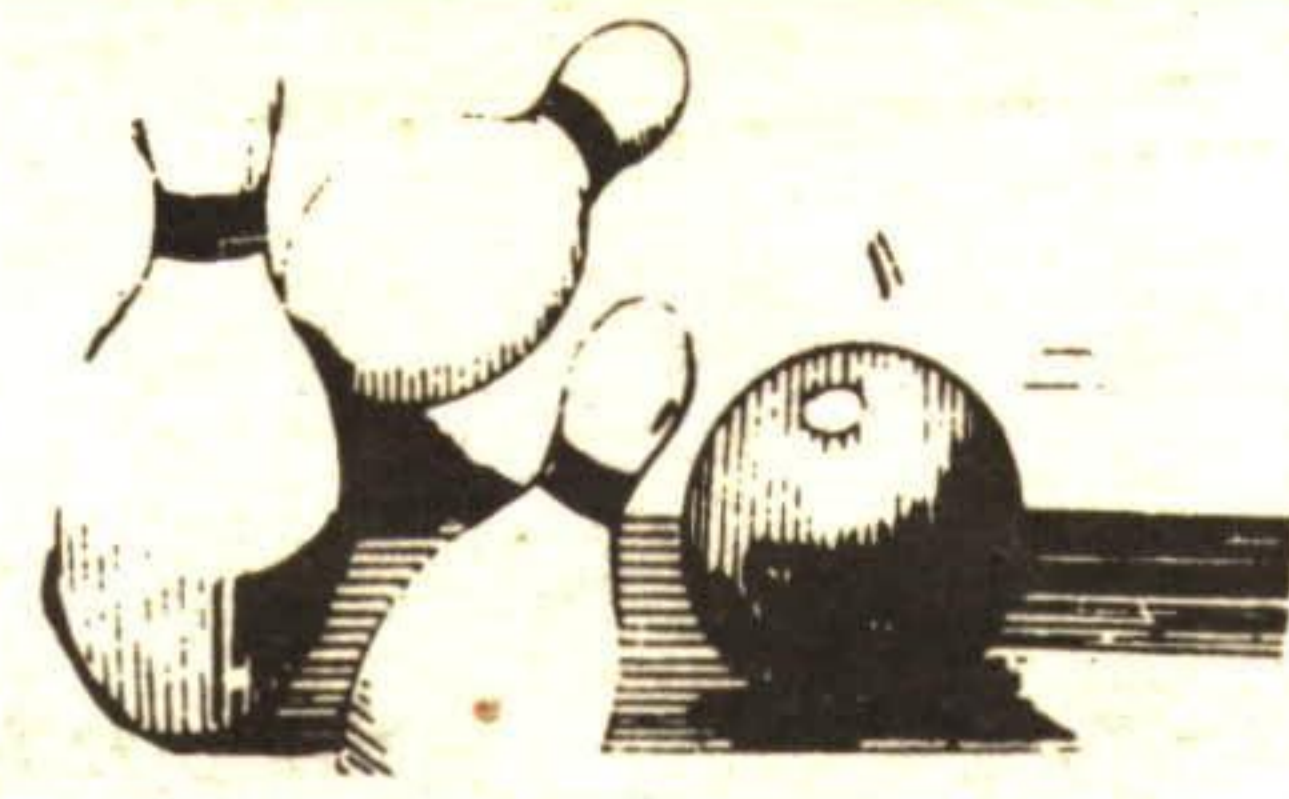

The third period was scoreless as both goalies, Acton's Robert Turpin and Georgetown's Dylan Lee, made a number of excellent saves.

Players of particular note included Acton's Mike Kempter and Jeff Garrard, and Georgetown's Dirk McKee and Thomas Arnold.
