me? These are questions we should all ask ourselves before we walk into a mall, parking lot or poorly lit

"If it doesn't feel right, get out" he warns. "Don't trust anyone other than your parents."

> The girls were all asked of a situation they were worried about and Mark gave them advice to deal with it. He told them to always have the right key ready for the door or car lock, and to lock the doors of the car as soon as they get in.

> Heidt has been teaching karate in the Milton area for more than three years but lately has branched out to give his 'streetproofing' course to various groups and organizations. He likes to keep it simple but effective.


> "Adefense move should be practiced,"he says,"until it is a reaction. In an actual attack, you don't have time to think, only react."

> The Ashgrove girls had lots of questions for Mark and he demonstrated simple ways to counter attacks. Primarily they should try concentrate on an area of the body where bones are close to the surface of the skin. It is more sensitive to a well placed blow or poke and can make the attacker lose his hold.

The next step is simple; run as far away as possible. Don't wait around to see if he is hurt. Then tell your parents and the police.

The Pathfinder leaders hope this training will never be needed. But out in the world it's good knowledge to carry around.

Some day it just might make a difference.




