Development opposed

proposal Athanasoulis and Katsilieris to redevelop the Canadiana Restaurant on Hwy.7 in Acton will soon be taken to the Ontario Municipal Board. Resident Joanne Vranic is opposing the development because of concerns over traffic and lack of privacy. Town Councillors approved Vranic's request Monday night to have the dispute settled by the OMB.

The Town of Halton Hills, in conjunction with the North Halton Association for the Developmentally Handicapped, will be hosting a Bike-A-Thon on Sunday, May 26 from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. The event will replace this year's annual Mayor's Road Race, in order to avoid dividing interest between the two events. The Bike-A-Thon will be used as a fundraising event for the NHADH. The proposed route is 23 km long, beginning at Ollie's Cycle Shop downtown, and ending up at Cedarvale Park. The route will wind through the urban and rural areas of town.


Stoop and Scoop


remind residents of it. Bylaw Enforcement Officer Bob Ustrzycki will be looking into the matter.
