Last night I dreamed I was once again teaching a class of girls I had taught many years ago, their faces as vivid before me as if it were yesterday. It was a Grade 11 class, and the subject was Pitman Shorthand. On this particular day, the Inspector had entered the classroom, and we were continuing the lesson as usual. It was

not until I was well into the lesson that I suddenly realized I had taught from this same textbook to this same class in Grade 10 and they had already passed the course. I decided I would have to confess my error to the class and Inspector, then quickly proceed into the Grade 11 text.

As I awoke, I realized that

many churches also do this; they go over the same teachings year after year. The Apostle Paul noticed this in the church at Corinth, and said that while newborn Christians need milk, older Christians require meat in order to grow up (1). Just as last year's textbook held little value once the girls had passed the course, so we must all dig into the Bible to get some meat if we hope to grow into Christian maturity! Like the Inspector who hadn't noticed the error, many older Christians do not realize they are being fed on a milk diet designed for babies!

The Apostle Paul pointed out to the Corinthian church that the reason they must go on into deep-

er teaching was because they were still living by their carnal nature with their envy, strife, and divisions. We, today, must also get rid of our carnal nature which emphasizes self, and root out sin if we are to build a solid faith.

It is essential to be born of God (2), and be filled with His Spirit (3). It is interesting to note, however, that even among those who have met these two requirements there are many living on last year's learning. For example, there are many who teach only the blessings we receive when we become a Christian, not realizing that although God does indeed bless, such blessings are not to add to human pride or self-indul-

gence. He expects us to go beyond self-interest into spiritual maturity, not wanting the highest position as did the disciples (4), but being willing to be a servant. We are to grow into the full stature of Christ (5), "no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine" (6).

Today, more than ever before, it is essential for Christians to grow up spiritually to avoid the deceptions springing up around us. Let us realize where we are at, as I did in my dream, and get some meat so we can become more than carnal Christians!


An evening of songs
