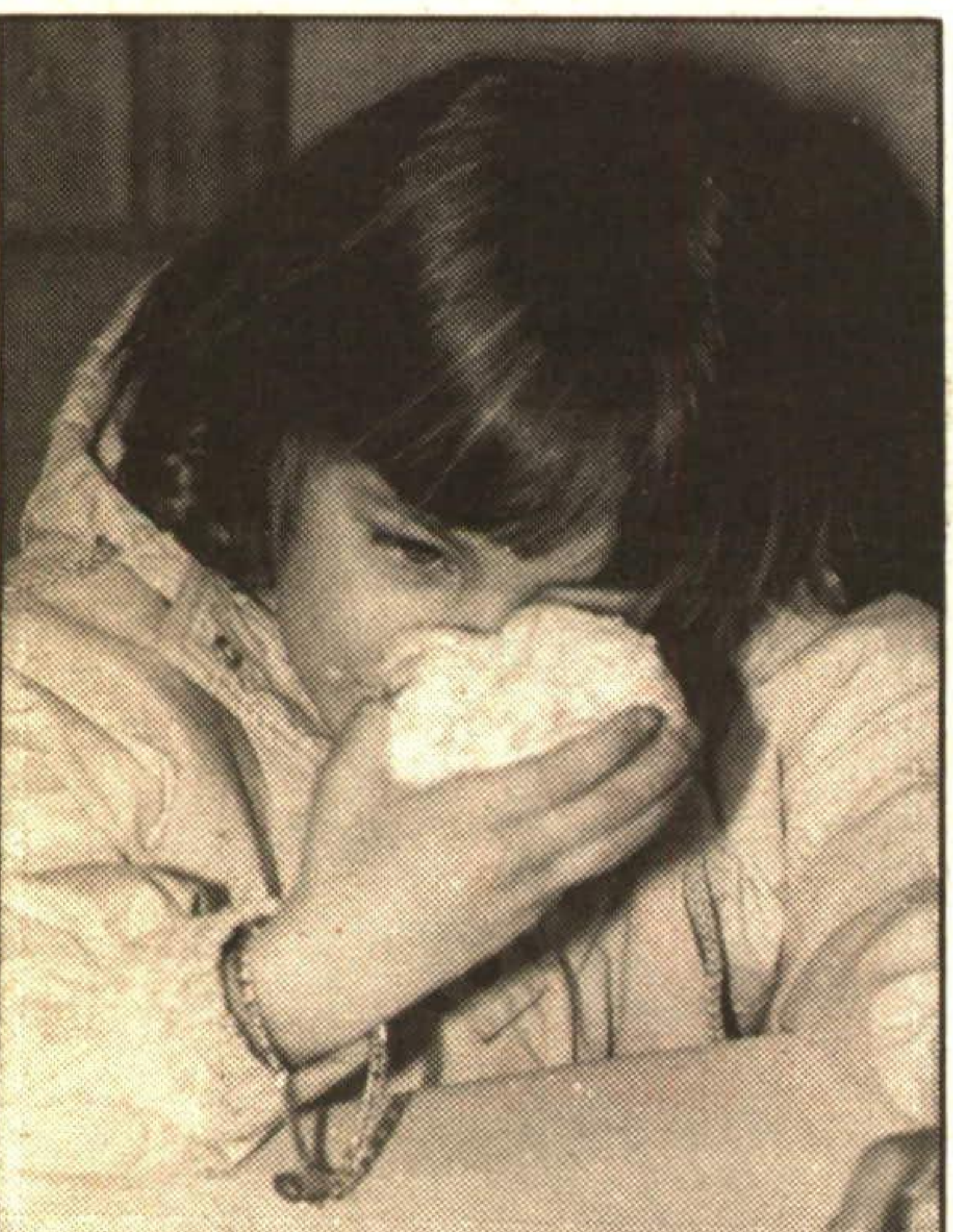
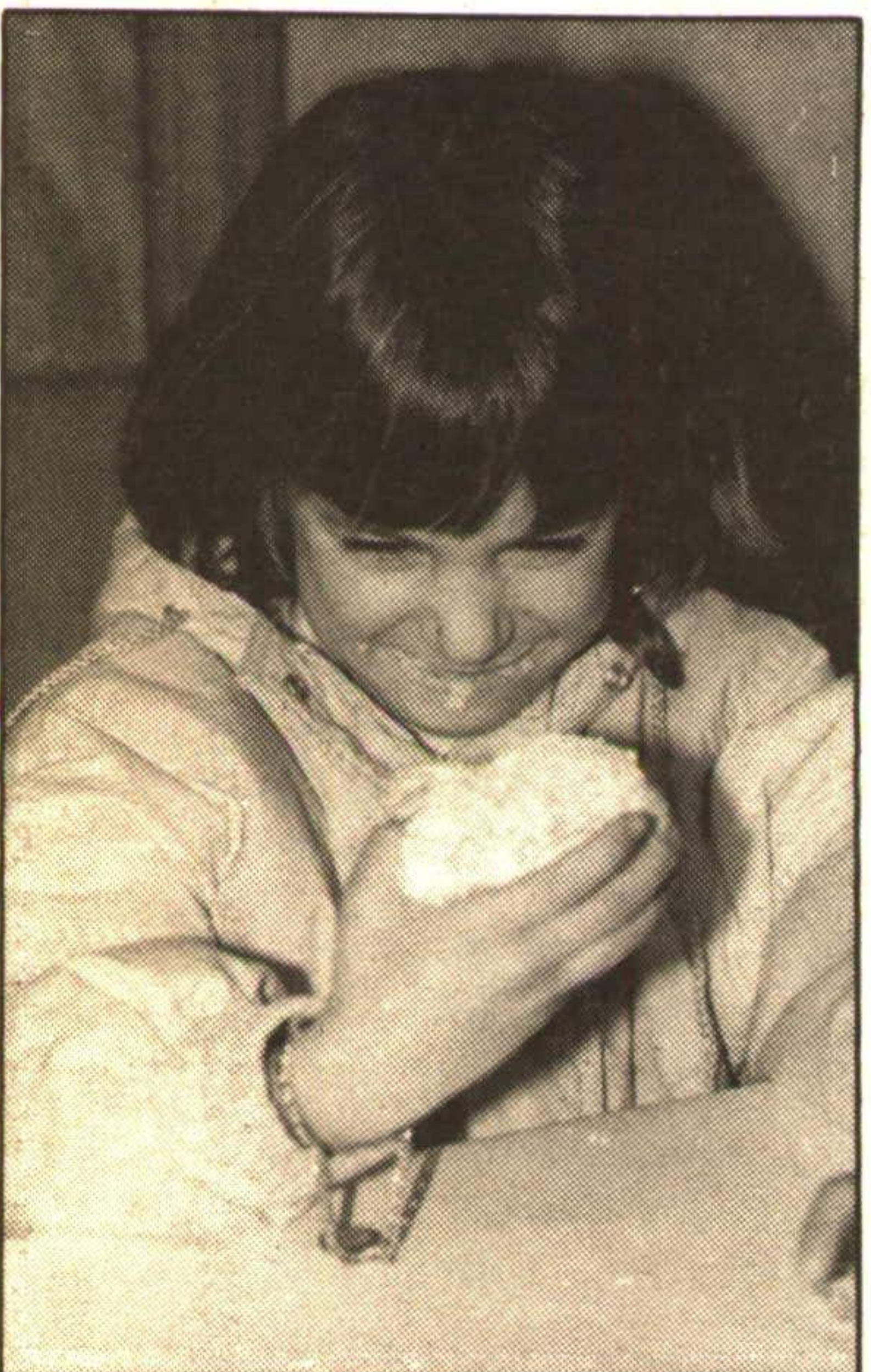
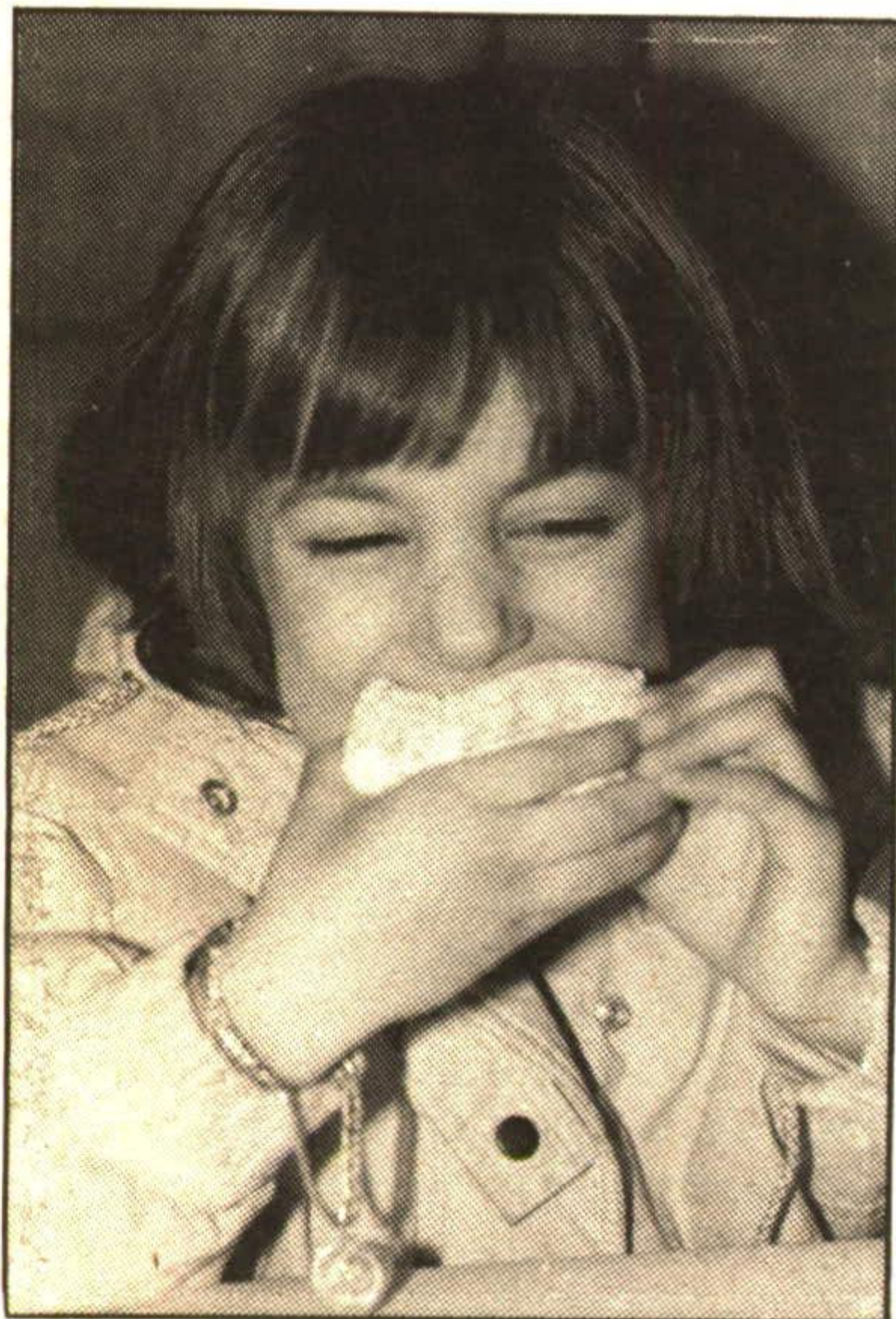


APRIL IS CANCER MONTH

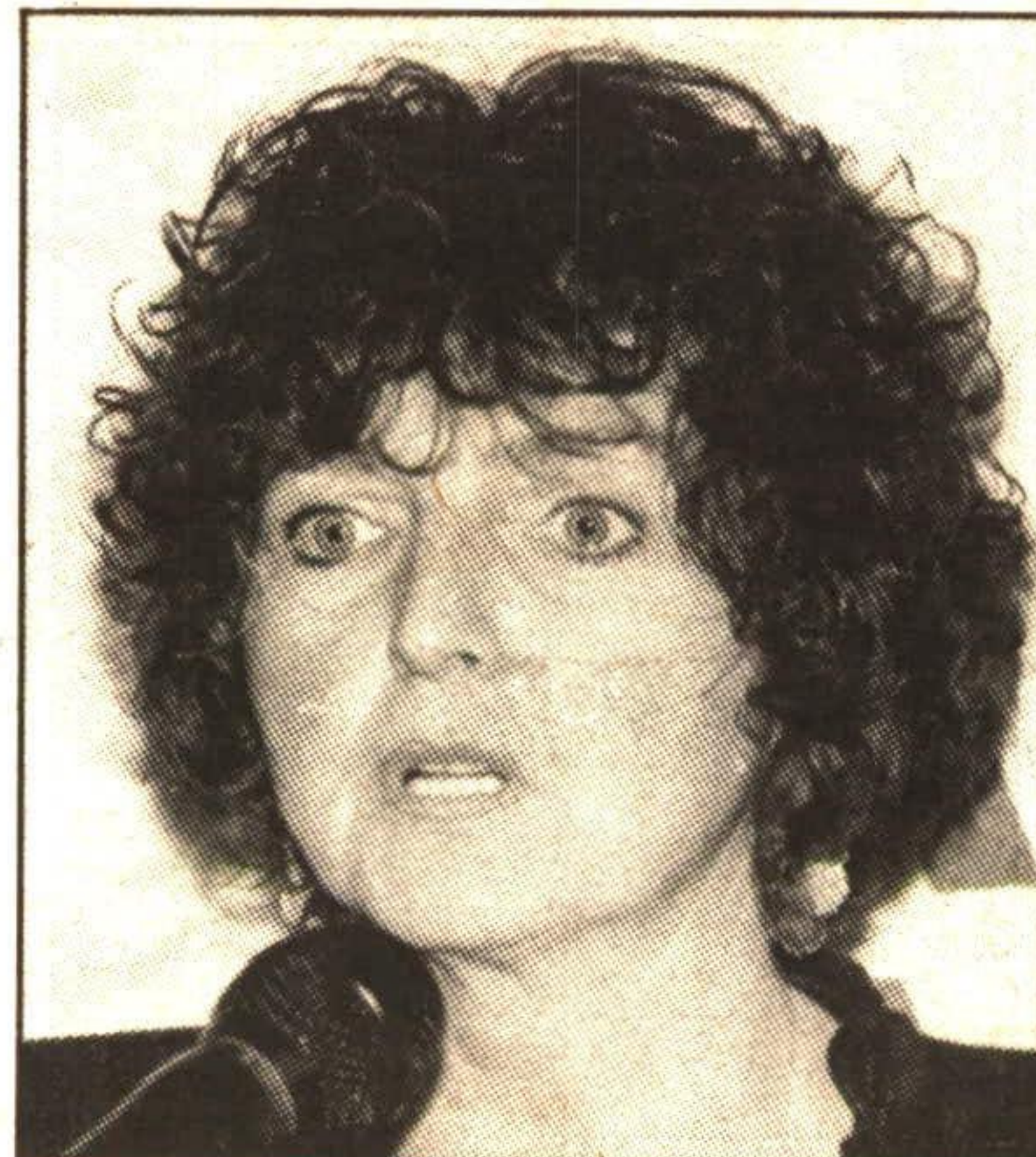
