We all need a Saviour

A good teacher uses blackboard illustrations to demonstrate the lesson being taught. God, in the same way, has illustrated New Testament truths by the use of Old Testament events. For example, there is a beautiful illustration of our need for a Saviour in the Old Testament!

Moses built an Ark which the people took with them wherever they went. God's presence could be felt as people came near it, and His glory could be seen around it like a cloud. Inside this Ark Moses placed "the Testimony,"2 the tablets upon which God had written the 10 Commandments. Within the Ark he also placed some of the manna with which God had fed them, and also the rod of Aaron which represented God's power.

We know today that the three articles in the Ark represented the triune God of the Christian: the Law represented Father God, the Manna represented Jesus, and the Rod of Aaron the Holy Spirit. Our one God of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is the "testimony" of our Christian faith, a testimony locked inside the ancient Ark for many years before the birth of

King Solomon placed the Ark of the Covenant in his temple at Jerusalem. Please note, however, that by this time the pot of Manna and the Rod of Aaron were no longer in the Ark; only the Law was there.3 Later, because he sinned in allowing foreign gods in his land, Solomon lost part of his kingdom. The removing of the Manna and Rod from the ancient Ark is symbolic of Solomon's sin in allowing other gods in his land. We, too, allow other gods than the triune God in our lives if we do not worship Jesus and His Spirit.

Just as the old Ark became lost in Solomon's time with only the Law, we too cannot save ourselves by merely keeping a set of laws. We can be saved only by Jesus' death and resurrection; nothing we can do can earn it! If we depend only on keeping the Law we revert to Judaism, and Jesus' death is all in vain!4

Jesus said that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.5 He alone is the Way to heaven; He alone is the Truth; and only through Him is there eternal life! As the Ark of the Covenant disappeared entirely after the removal of the items representing Jesus and His Spirit, the Bible tells us that those who deny the risen Christ will not be

The story of the Ark of the Covenant shows us we need Jesus Christ and His resurrected Spirit as part of the Godhead (trinity) in order to be saved. We all need a 'Saviour'!

Behold, I have carved you on the palms on my hands.' (Isaiah 49)


And so...the 'piece de resistance'...


