Kingsmill sales office vandalized

About \$4,000 damage was done at the sales office of Kingsmill on the Credit, on Maple Ave. and Mountainview Rd.

A suspect broke into the office by getting into a window which was four feet off the ground on Monday night, Halton Regional Police said. The suspect stole a microwave, two telephones and a calculator.

Glass doors into an office where offers to purchase and purchase agreements are kept were broken, and all the files removed, and thrown around the room. Other files were not disturbed, police report.

Glass on a large framed print of the future development was broken, and the print was torn from

the wall. Other individual framed floorplans also had the glass broken, but these were left on the wall. A scale model of the development at the centre of the office was pushed over on its side.

Police said that a hydro box was damaged last week, and the phones were out of service for an unknown reason. The alarm system was also out of order.

Workmen noticed the damage when they came in at 7 a.m. Tuesday morning to prepare the land using bulldozers.

The investigation of the incident is on-going.

Rail museum opens May 4

The Halton County Radial Railway Association is on its way to creating a history of its own with 36 years behind it as its north Milton museum opens for its 19th season on Saturday, May 4.

The Halton County Radial Railway is an operating museum noted for its electric railway. The attraction is the work of the volunteer members of the association.

Visitors can ride nostalgic streetcars over two km of track through a hardwood forest in a valley at the edge of the Niagara Escarpment. The woods are blanketed with white trilliums (Ontario's emblem) in the spring. The season finishes in a blaze of autumn colors. Facilities are available for disabled people to ride on special cars.

Other attractions at the museum include: exhibits in car houses and old C.N.R. Rockwood Station, a picnic area, a slide show (by prior arrangement), instructive programs (by prior arrangement), meeting room available on request, bus parking, scenic rock garden and water fall, and an ice cream parlor. There are also many opportunities for photography.

The museum's collection is displayed in three car barns which house more than 50 pieces of transportation equipment, some dating back to 1893.

Special events this season include a summer extravaganza, a roaring '20s fall picnic, and a Christmas fiesta. A number of night shows are scheduled during the summer and winter as well.

The museum is located on the Guelph Line, Halton Region Road 1, near Rockwood, 16 km north of Highway 401, Exit 312.

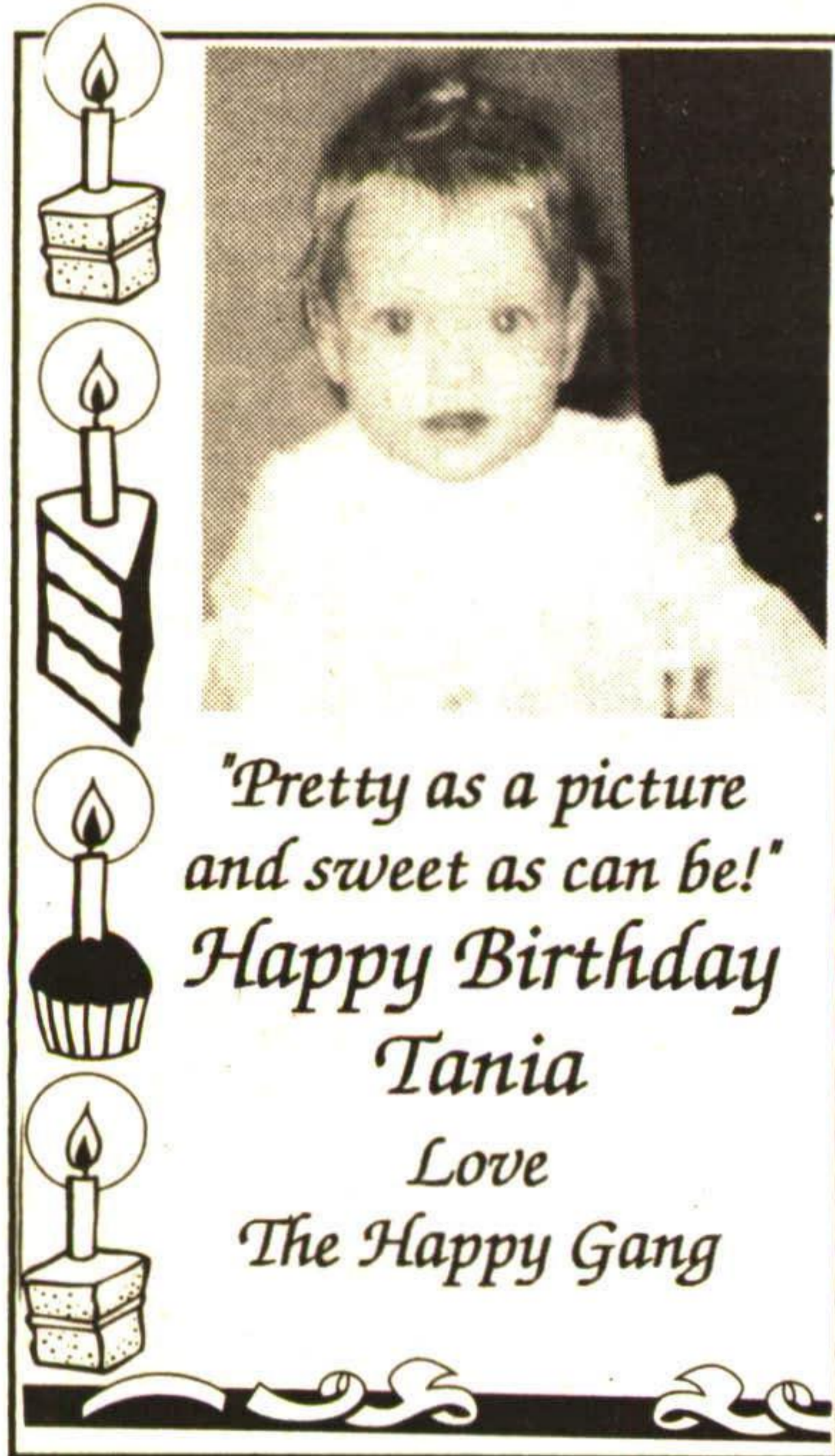
