Police lay criminal charges against Adults Only Video store manager

Halton Regional Police have laid six criminal charges against the manager and owner of the Adults Only Video Store in Georgetown.

Manager Kenneth Finney of Etobicoke and owner Randy Jorgensen will appear in court in Milton on June 3. They are both charged with two counts of possession of obscene material for the purposes of sale, two counts of expos- obscene, nor will they end up back ing obscene material to public view and one count of renting and one count of selling obscene material.


