

Georgetown grabs two Zone finals firsts

Georgetown youth bowlers again hogged the limelight, closely followed by Bolton, over the other ten areas of Central Ontario.

The Zone Finals of the "Bowler of the Year" Ontario Championships were held at Georgetown Bowl last Sunday. The tournament director was Georgetown's Andy Parent as zone rep of the Youth Bowling Council.

Georgetown captured two firsts, the Pee-Wee and the Junior division, a second in the senior division and a third in the bantam section.

Six-year-old William Walker, a smurf, captured the higher pee-wee division by one pin over the runner-up, Ryan Neilly from Brampton. The bantam division was won by Lisa McNeil of Bolton with local competitor Chad Conrad placing third by 23 pins.

Georgetown's top junior bowler, Cindy Clarke, started with a 188 game but came back with 269 and 266 to win the first place plaque by 27 pins over Jamie Coulter from Bolton. Fabbio Lanica of Bolton took first place in the senior YBC section while Sharon Shapcott of Georgetown, bowling below par, still managed to secure the runner-up position (second place).

This year Georgetown bowlers were represented in all the past provincial finals of the different tournaments and in all those still to come. This banner year must be quite a credit to the many efforts of Georgetown's coaches and instructors.

Ouida Graville and Audrey Jans had 1-6, 5-7, and in three sets,

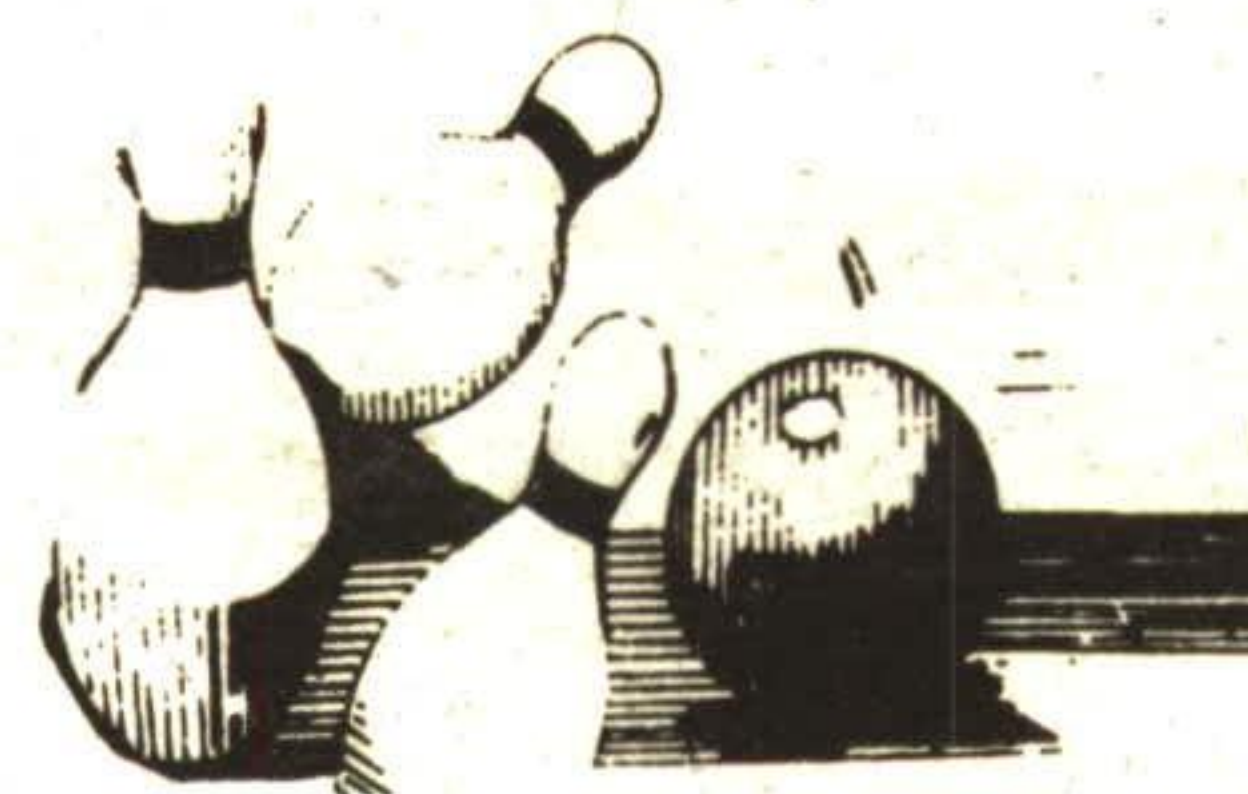
Joanne Van Den Hoek and Eileen Saville had scores of 3-6, 7-6, 1-6.
