

A Glen Williams family claims its peace and quiet is constantly being threatened by dirt bikers tearing through their neighborhood, and they feel nothing can be done about

"We moved out of Brampton to get a little peace and quiet — I don't want these guys around here making all that noise," said the Park St. resident, who asked not to be identified.

Children under the supervision of the Halton Children's Aid Society will travel in added comfort and safety in new car seats. The seats will be purchased with part of a \$50,000 provincial grant given to the agency for equipment purchases and upgrades.

Zanana Akande, Ontario's Minister of Community and Social Services said that the Halton CAS, 465 Morden Road in Oakville, will use the one-time funding to purchase office equipment and furniture, and a fire alarm system, as well as the children's car seats.

"For many years the Halton CAS has been doing a superlative job providing services for children and families," she added. "The new car seats will allow foster parents and workers to transport children. They will also be used in the CAS van, which, I understand is a mini-bus donated by the local Variety Club.

"I know that the balance of the assistance from our ministry will be spent wisely on furnishings and equipment to help the Halton CAS do an even better job. And the new fire alarm system will make it a safer place in which to work."

bikers" constantly ride their machines on the hill behind his home, known locally as Groundhog Hill, after school and on every weekend.

He claims the noise gets so loud, he cannot sit on his porch in comfort because it drowns out conversa-

"It's been very aggravating — if I want to barbeque or anything, I can't," he said. "I can't turn on our radio or talk on the deck because the noise is so loud.

"I was told by a police officer there is really nothing they can do because they don't own an off- road vehicle. By the time they show up, the kids disappear.

"But, it does seem that every time I see a police car around the neighborhood, the kids leave, so they might be doing something."

According to bylaw enforcement officer Ron Stein, the onus is on the owner of the property to prevent trespassers. Groundhog Hill is presently owned by a development corporation.


Although there is a noise bylaw, enforcement is often difficult, Stein added.

"Normally, if a complaint came in, we'd get in touch with the owner of the property and let him know what's going on, because he is responsible," Stein said. "If the lot is vacant, as in this case, we would suggest to the owner that he take the necessary measures to prevent the problems."


Stein added that it would be helpful for the complainant to keep a diary of events for two to three weeks, documenting when the problems occur. He must also be willing to testify in court, Stein said.

"We'd give the owner a set time to comply, and if he doesn't, we'll charge him," Stein added. "But, we'll give him fair warning." A few weeks ago the area behind Groundhog Hill was the scene of a
