Notice is hereby given pursuant to Section 298 and 301 of The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302 as amended, that the Council for the Regional Municipality of Halton proposes at its meeting on June 26, 1991 to pass a by-law for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of two bridge structures along Steeles Avenue west of the Fifth Line and Sixth Line in the Town of Halton Hills.

Plans showing the proposed works may be inspected at the Public Works Department offices, 2316 South Service Road, West, Oakville, Ontario, during normal business hours.

On Wednesday, June 19, 1991 at 9:30 a.m. at the Town of Milton, Victoria Park Square, Milton, Ontario, Committee Room, Regional Council through its Planning and Public Works Committee will hear in person, or by his Counsel, any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the said by-law and who applies to the Regional Clerk, no later than Thursday, June 6, 1991 to be heard.

During the rehabilitation, traffic crossing over these bridges will be restricted to one lane in alternating directions until such time as the work is completed.
