The championship game between MLM and Burns seemed to be the closest match of the day, with the final score of 20-18 for MLM. Former

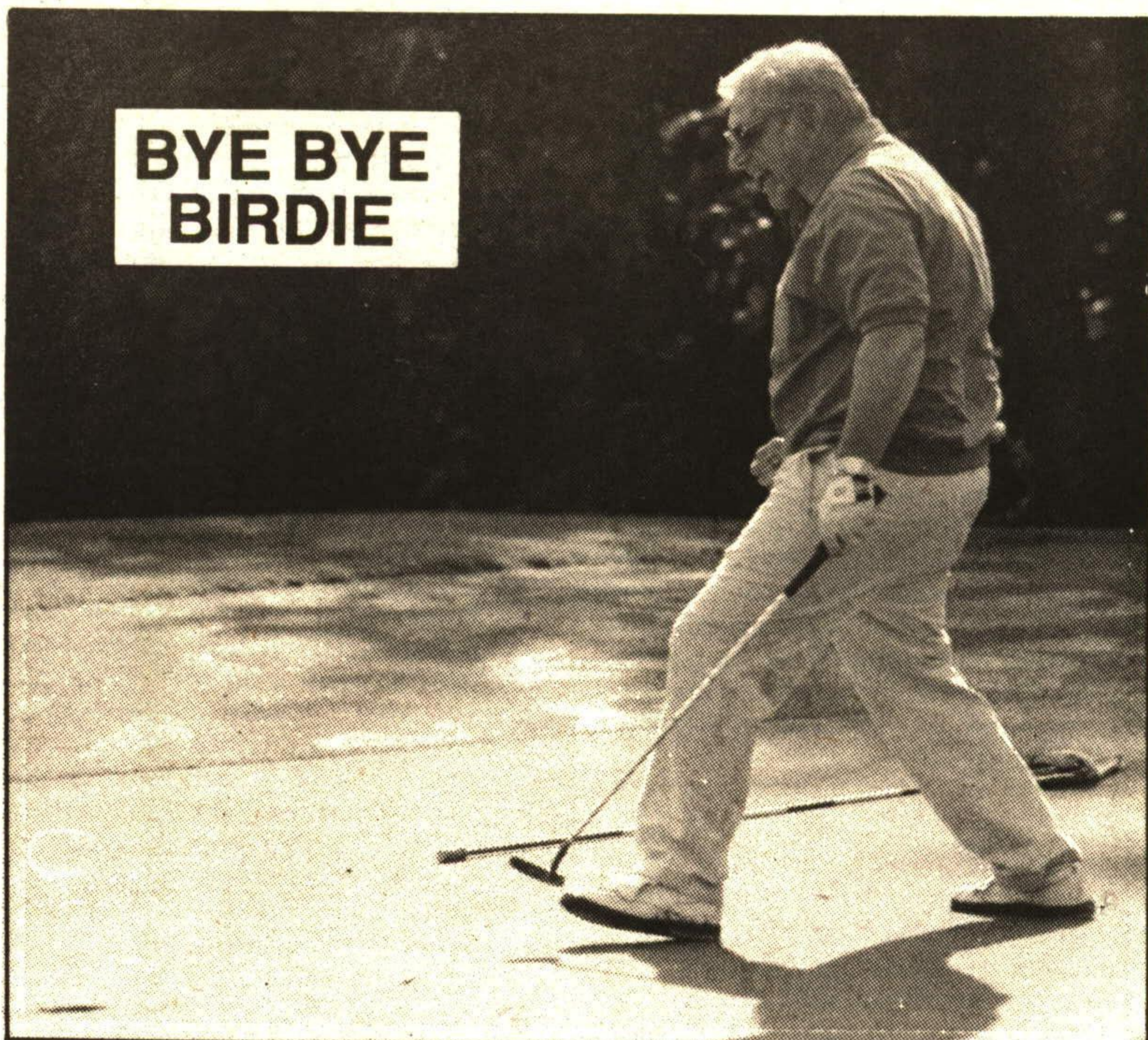
