Motorists beware! Traffic records now exchanged between provinces

Ontario motorists convicted of driving violations in Manitoba, Alberta and Newfoundland will now have demerit points applied to their home province driving record.

Exchange of traffic offence conviction information began with Quebec in 1989 and was extended to the other three provinces on June 1, 1991 under the Canadian Driver Licence Compact, signed last January by Ontario Transportation Minister Ed Philip.

The Canadian Driver Licence Compact covers eight categories dealing with 80 per cent of all traffic offence convictions in Ontario. Offences under the compact are: failure to stop for a red light or stop sign; failure to stop for a school bus; speeding; dangerous or careless driving; failure to remain at the scene of an accident; failure to report an accident; racing; passing where prohibited.

Before implementation, only information on Criminal Code convictions, such as impaired driving and criminal negligence was exchanged by Canadian jurisdictions. All jurisdictions, except British Columbia, have agreed to exchange traffic conviction information.

Grocery store tour promotes healthy eating

Halton Region offers guided tours to good nutrition.

Lynn Gates, a community health nutritionist for Halton, conducts tours of a Burlington grocery store that offer participants a chance to learn more about what commonly available foods are good for them — and which ones aren't.

Halton Region's heallth commissioner, Dr. Bob Nosal, said the program "has met with great approval" among those taking part. "We want to take it a step further and target elderly people and those

on a restricted income." Dr. Nosal said the supermarket, in this case Burlington's Supercentre, is an "ideal" location to deliver a nutrition education program since such a large cross-section of the community can be reached, and because "80 per cent of food purchasing decisions are

made at the grocery store."

Participants phone the Region to be part of the Tuesday evening tour, in which low fat foods are pointed out by brand name, with the rationale provided as to why they are healthy food choices.

So far 238 people have taken the tour, in which the emphasis is on actually changing unhealthy eating habits, rather than simply making people aware of what's good for them and what isn't, Gates said.

The regional nutrition expert said it's "a common myth" that healthier eating is more expensive than the alternative. In reality "healthier foods are much cheaper", especially by weight. One of the resons for this, she pointed out, is the cost of processing and additives in so-called junk food.

The program is restricted in scope by financing. Gates is one of tour, phone 639-5141.

only two people in regional government with a nutrition background. So currently there are no plans to expand the tour to other centres. But the idea of broadening the program to include more emphasis on the elderly and poorer people was approved by the regional helath and social services committee meeting recently.

Gates said good nutrition habits don't have to be a burden. "The goal is to try and make it as easy as possible." People don't have to live on bean sprouts - the old '60s idea of nutrition. We try and provide a really positive message."

She said she believes that if people eat healthy foods 80 per cent of the time, they can, with no ill effects, eat whatever they please the other 20 per cent of the time.


