

# Escarpment Plan Review hearings begin Aug. 12

The Environmental Assessment Board has announced that the Niagara Escarpment Plan

Review hearings will be held in Burlington and Owen Sound beginning in August. The focus

will be on changes to the Niagara Escarpment Plan as proposed by the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC).

The hearings will open at the Burlington Council chambers on August 12, continuing into September. They will begin in Owen Sound, at the Grey County Council Chambers, on September 10 and continue until late October.

Evening sessions have been scheduled to hear the comments and concerns of people who cannot attend day-time sessions. These evening sessions will be held in Burlington on August 21 and 28 and in Owen Sound on September 17 and October 16.

Mary Munro and John McClellan, members of the Environmental Assessment Board, have been appointed to conduct these hearings.

There were 175 written submissions to the Niagara Escarpment Commission during a four month public comment period which ended May 31.

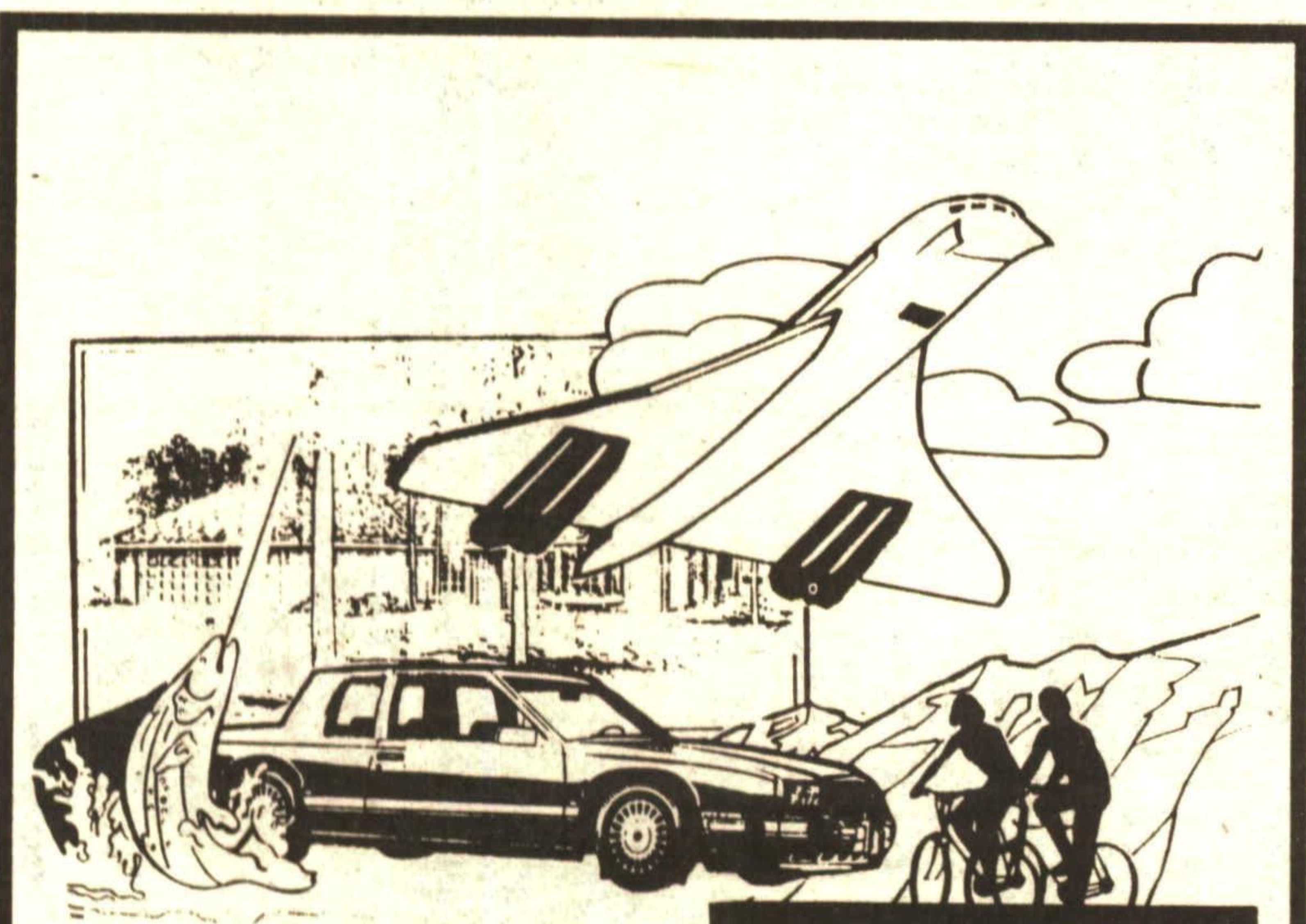
All incoming calls to 451-1710 will re-route to the automated attendant (796-4066) is the call is

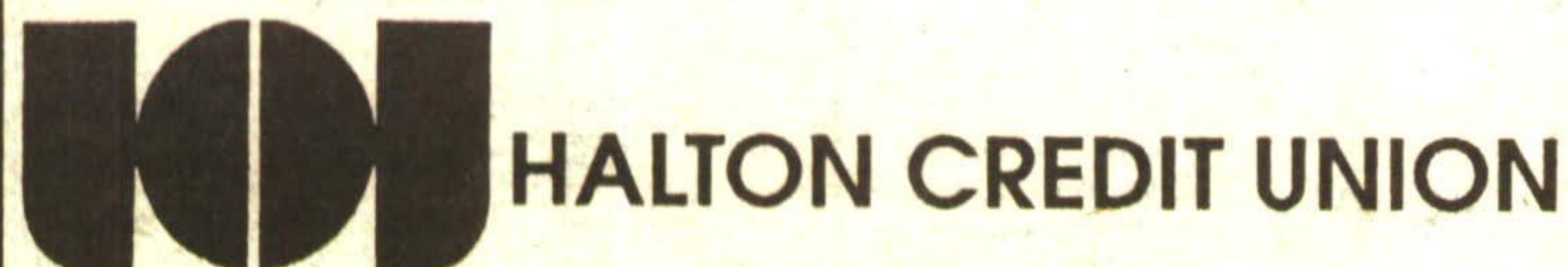

## Man charged twice

A 40-year-old Cheltenham man was charged twice in one day with impaired driving.

The man was pulled over by a police officer after he was spotted

driving erratically on Friday at 2 a.m. on 10th Line near 17 Sdrd. The man was charged with impaired driving and having over 80 mg of alcohol per 100 ml of blood, police said. The man appeared in court the same day, where he was released on the condition that he would keep the peace and abstain from drinking alcohol, police said.

At 9:30 p.m. Friday night he was spotted by the same officer on Mountainview Rd. at John St. in the same vehicle driving erratically, police said. Not only was he charged with the same charges once again, but also with breach of recognizance, because he promised to be on good behavior during his release.

A first offence of impaired driving carries a \$300 to \$500 fine and a 12-month suspension from driving. A second offence carries an automatic 14-day jail sentence, police said.
