GREEN THUMB GARDENING

COMPACT ANDORRA

An Evergreen with a Difference

There is a spreading evergreen that is slightly different than its counterparts. Most evergreens remain green in color throughout the year. However, the Compact Andorra acquires a burgundy color in the fall that remains through the winter months. When it starts to grow again in the spring, the burgundy hue disappears and the shrub is a blue green color for the growing season.

The Compact Andorra is a low, dense, spreading evergreen that works well in foundation plantings (next to the house) and mixed flower beds. It grows relatively fast and can attain a diameter of approximately three feet with an attractive flat, circular top. Due to its low stature (8 to 10 inches), it is wise to plant it at the front of the garden bed, or as a ground cover.

This is a shrub that is renowned for its ability to adapt, and withstand hot, dry conditions and tolerate a wide range of soil conditions. Like all evergreens, this shrub should be fertilized regularly throughout the growing season with a fertilizer high in the first number, such as: 30-10-10.

The Compact Andorra makes an attractive mat-like shrub with an interesting plum purple hue in the dormant season.
