Out of the running:

Neither Ward 4 Town council incumbent LIL BOWMAN, nor Wards 1 and 2 public school board incumbent ARLENE BRUCE will be seeking re-election. Newcomer ARTHUR TREBBNE was first to announce his candidacy in the election, but within weeks, became the first to withdraw.

Except in cases where candidates are acclaimed, registered voters in each ward vote for a mayor, two council members with local municipal duties only, a third council member who (along with the mayor) also represents the ward on Regional council, one school trustee for either the public or separate school board and one Halton Hills Hydro commissioner.

Hewitt reminds of local experience

ment from the Province before we proceed further.

"We do not pay a penny more unless the Province comes through," he added. "They have shown their willingness, and I hope to extract that direction from them."

Halton Hills councillor Joe Hewitt reminded his colleagues of the "Georgetown experience" where development plans for the Silver Creek Valley were altered several times due to residents' concerns.

He noted the new focus will help prevent that situation from occurring again because the public's concerns will be heard before any plans are made.

"It will parallel the environmental assessment process with the planning process," he added. "This is a comprehensive approach where the two will be running parallel."

Public Works commissioner Art Leitch concurred, adding the Region "is just trying to find a better way of doing things."

"There is obviously a feeling among the public that environmental concerns are not taken into account early enough in the process," he said. "There is a lot of frustration with the EAA, but what is being tried here is to try and find a better way than existing legislation. What is proposed is to bring in during the early planning stages environmental concerns."

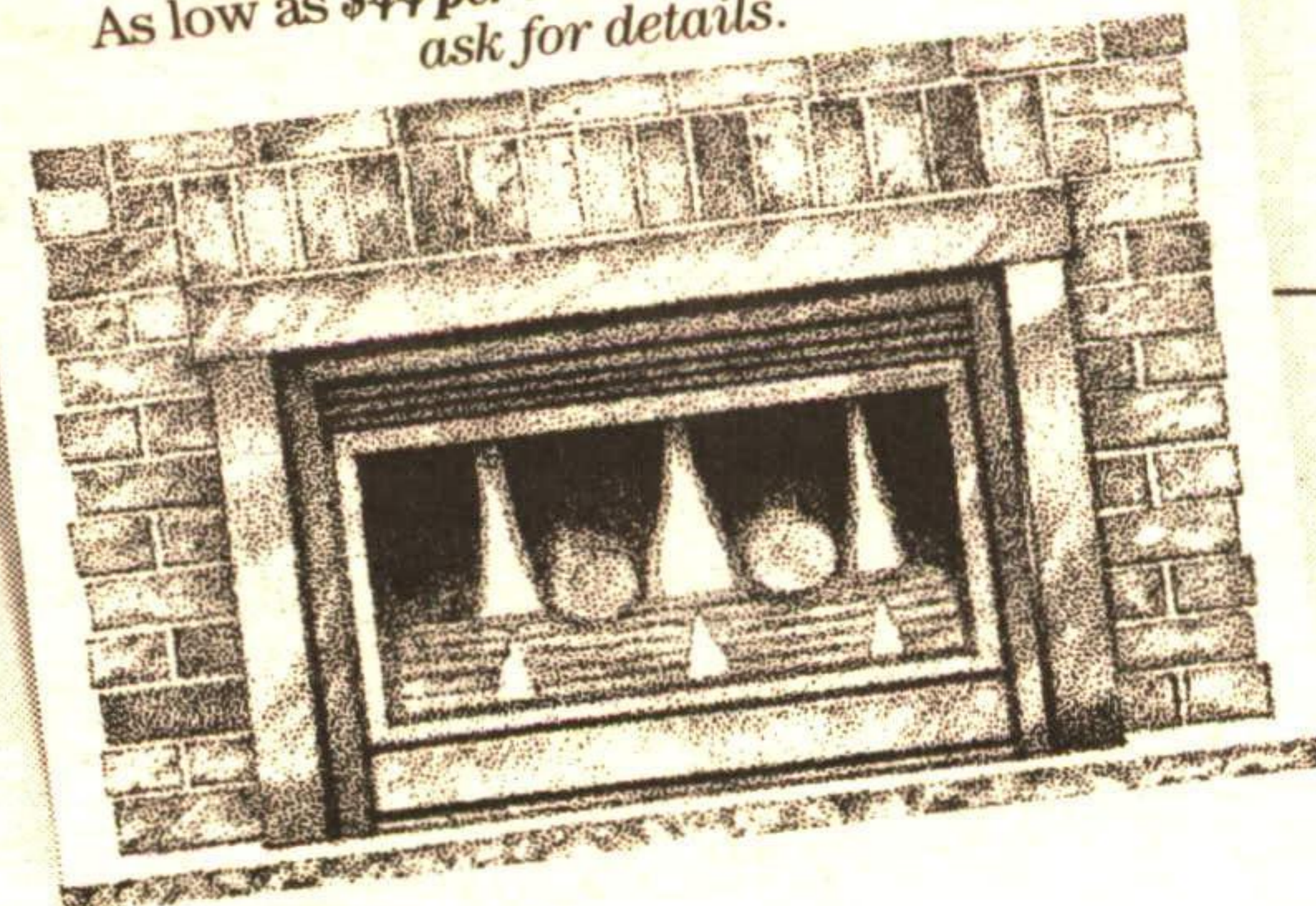
