Former Acton High School student, Andreas Thiel will perform 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, October 6 in the University of Guelph's Autumn at the Arboretum series.

Thiel began his formal piano studies with Anya Laurence, a former music faculty member of the University of Guelph. He has performed recitals in many Ontario cities as well as eastern U.S. This summer he appeared in concerts in Switzerland and is scheduled to play in New York and other American cities in 1992.

Thiel is the recipient of several awards including first prize, Edward Johnson Piano Competition; first prize, Hamilton Kiwanis Festival senior piano (five categories) and has been a finalist in the Ontario division of the Canadian

Music Festivals. In his honor, a music scholarship was inaugurated by the Acton District High School.

On Sunday, the program will include: Sonata in A minor, Op. 42 by Franz Schubert; Six Piano Pieces, Op. 118 by Johannes Brahms and Hungarian Rhapsody No. 12 by Franz Liszt.

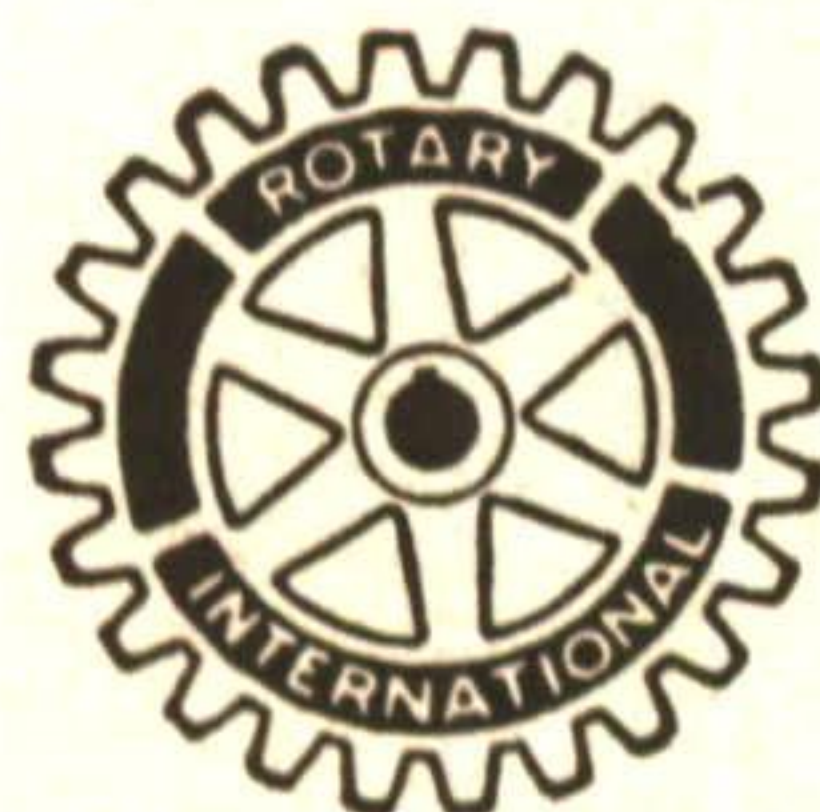
Students will be introduced to an alphabet style known as Black
