

Council rejects garden centre

A farm dealership and garden centre proposed for the 10th Line and Mayfield Rd. was turned down by council Monday night.

Councillors agreed with colleague Joe Hewitt that the application "flies in the face of the Official Plan and zoning."

Hewitt argued it will not service the farm industry but rather will

"cater to the home owner." Mayor Russ Miller agreed, noting it will be "an infringement on the rural setting."

Halton Hills Planning staff had recommended the five-acre business be approved.

Acton Santa Claus Parade

Once again, Acton's annual Santa Claus Parade will be rolling through town on Saturday, Nov. 16 from 1-2:30 p.m. It will begin at McKenzie-Smith Public School and then proceed to Queen St., Mill to Main, north to River St. and then conclude on Willow St. The roads in question will be closed to regular traffic during the parade.

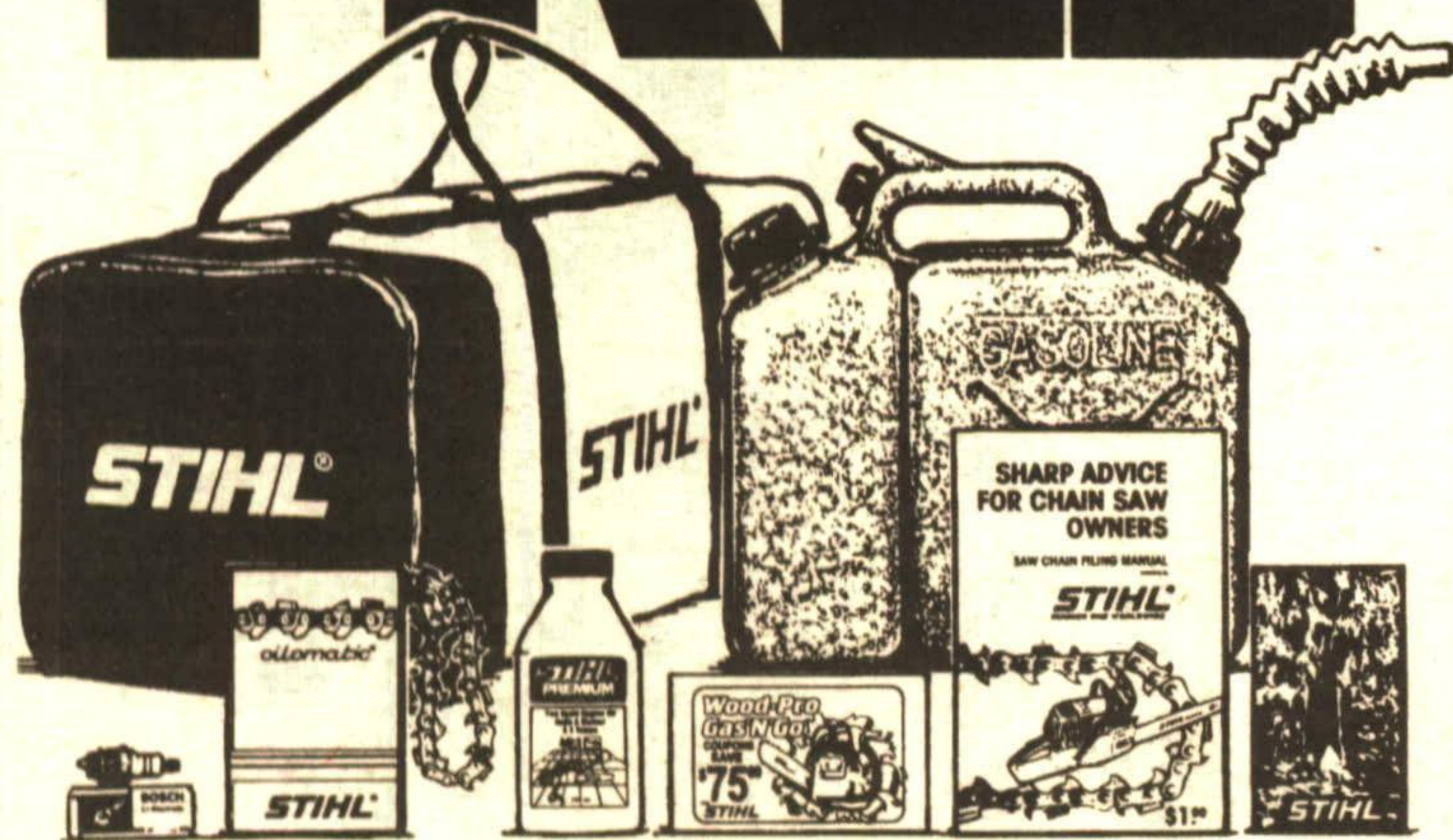

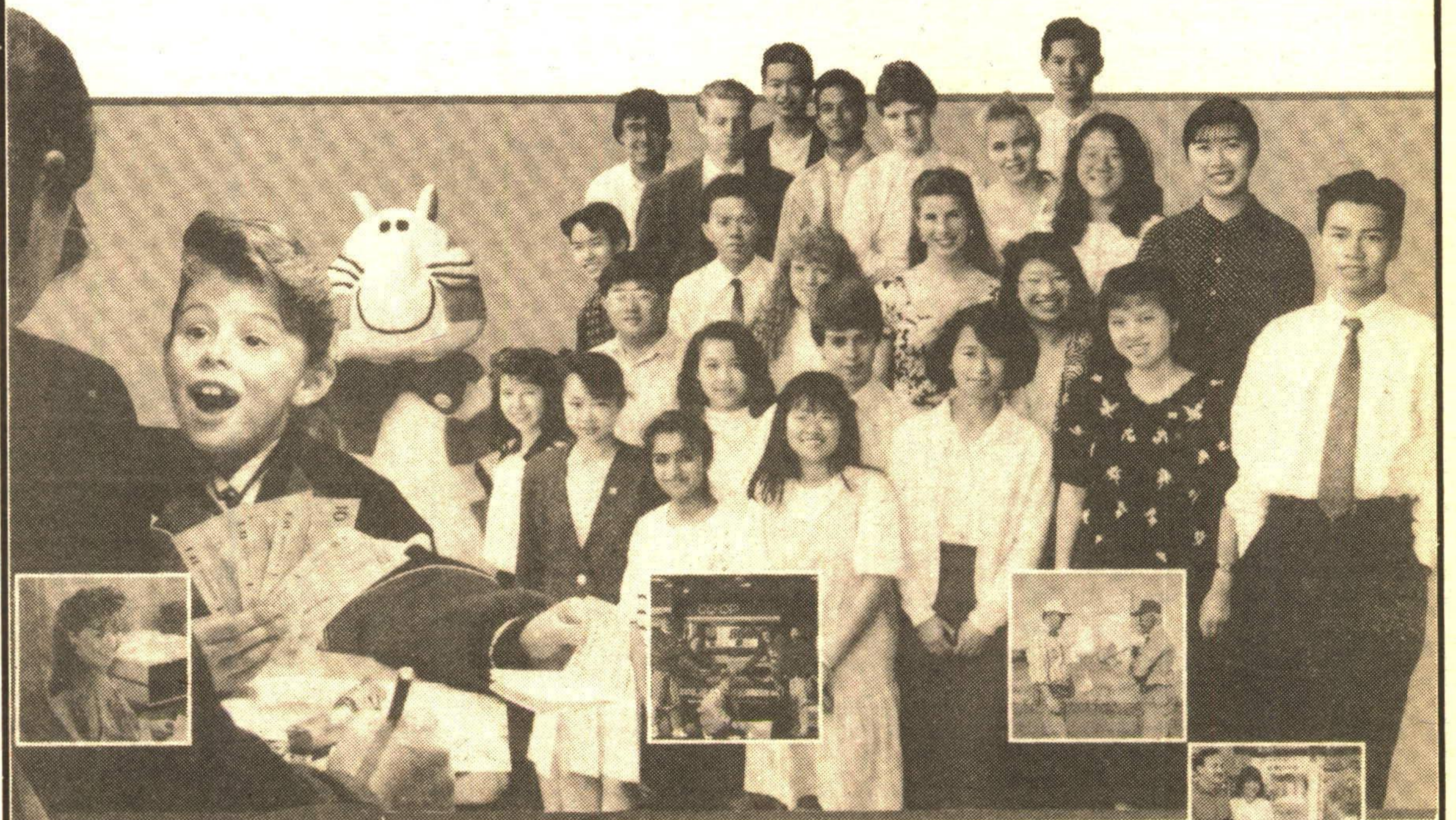
