
Wildlife artist Carl Brenders here Wednesday

Terry Champ prepares for My Fair Lady



Terry has been involved with local musical theatre for a number of years both on stage and in the orchestra pit. A musical director must not only make sure that the vocal score is in perfect pitch for the whole performance, but also assembles, rehearses and directs the orchestra for the show. This means Terry rehearses at least three times a week with the on-stage cast and he has added rehearsals on the weekends with the orchestra.

Once Terry is comfortable that cast and orchestra have their music in hand, the two elements of the show begin working together, usually three or four weeks before opening night. It is not an easy job - it takes someone who has a real love of music to take on the task. With a lot of dedication and "With a Little Bit of Luck,"


