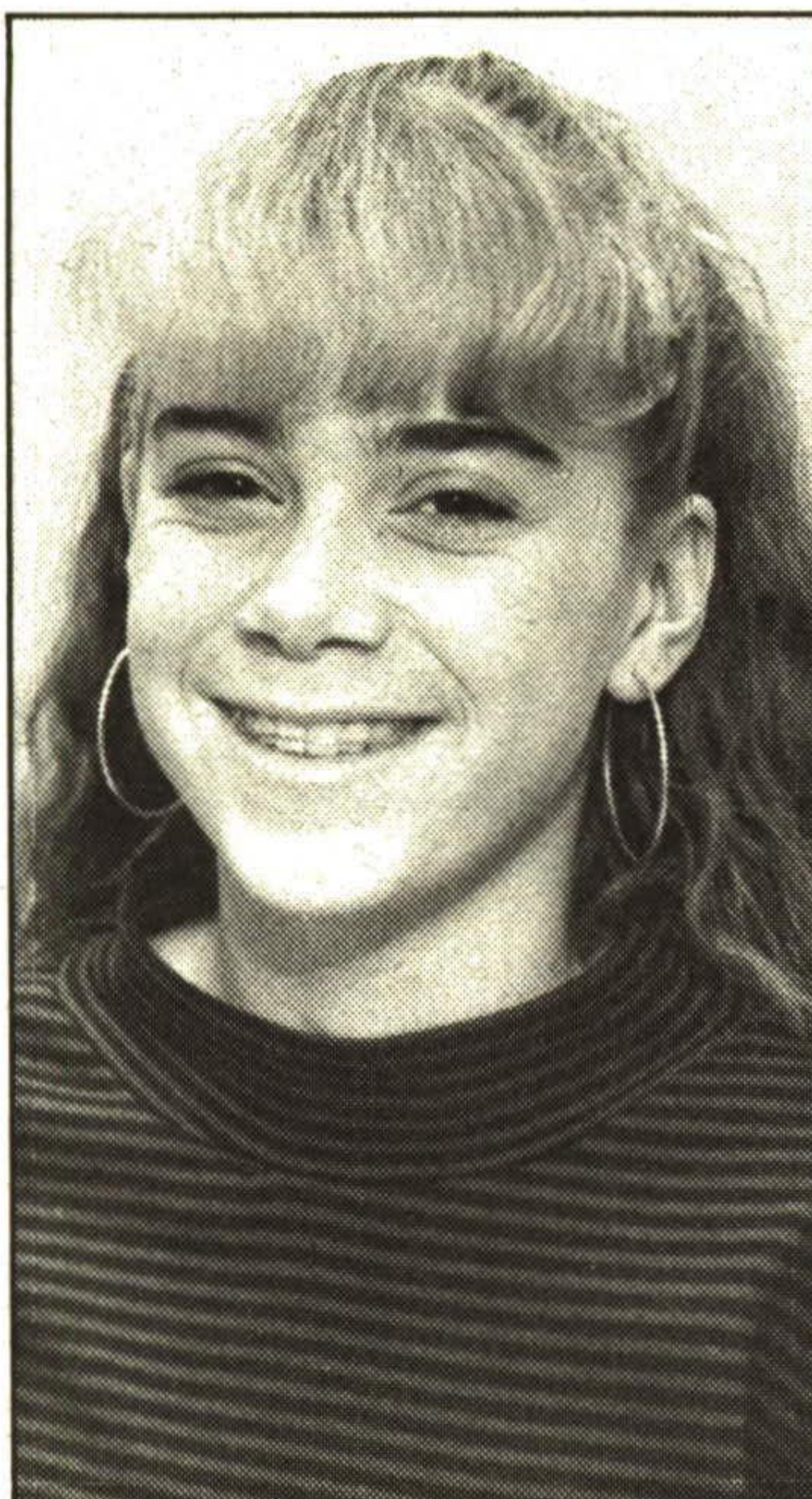
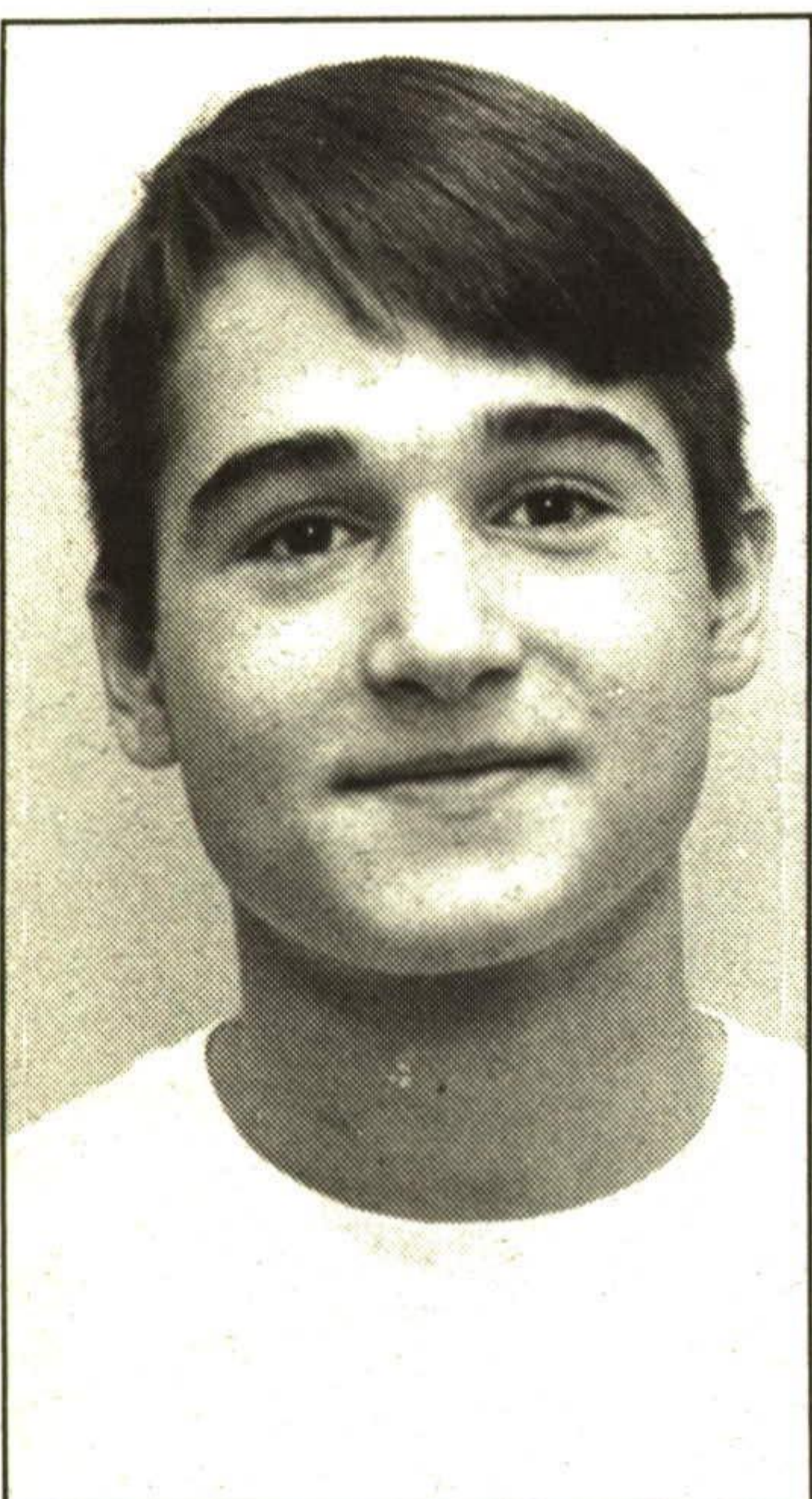


Athletes of the Week

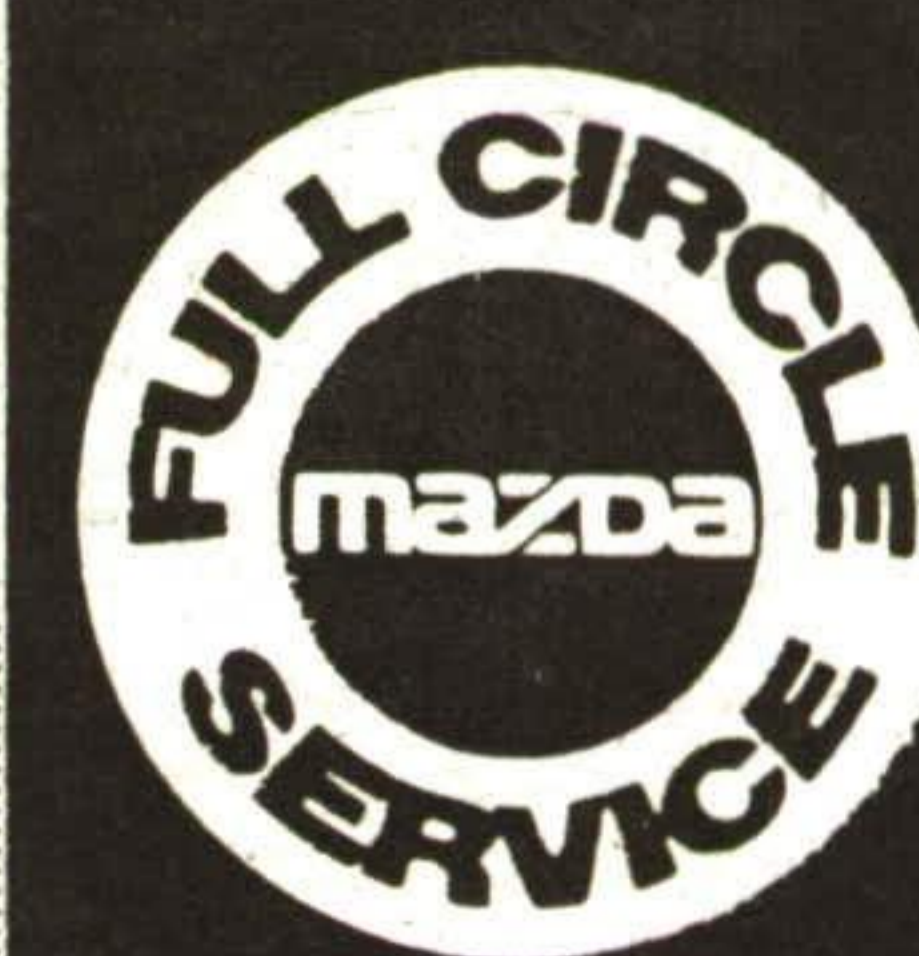
