

Ward 4 candidates

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Cook stated he is proud of his involvement in forming the town's Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC), while Norton is pleased with his work on the Activan committee.

Serjeantson said her "13 years of hard work, making honest, responsible decisions on behalf of Ward 4" is something she is proud of, while Pilutti believed constructing 40 low cost townhouses a number of years ago was a "good start for young couples."

Resident Jim Broughton asked what specific proposals each of the candidates have in mind for Ward 4.

One of Pilutti's pet projects is to extend the urban boundary from the Eighth Line to Trafalgar Rd., and designate the lands industrial. He firmly believes that by putting industry there, instead of Georgetown South, a proper buffer zone will exist between the businesses and Georgetown residences. In addition, it will also provide more industrial land, that can easily be serviced with water and sewage.

Walton noted that basement apartments should be regulated to

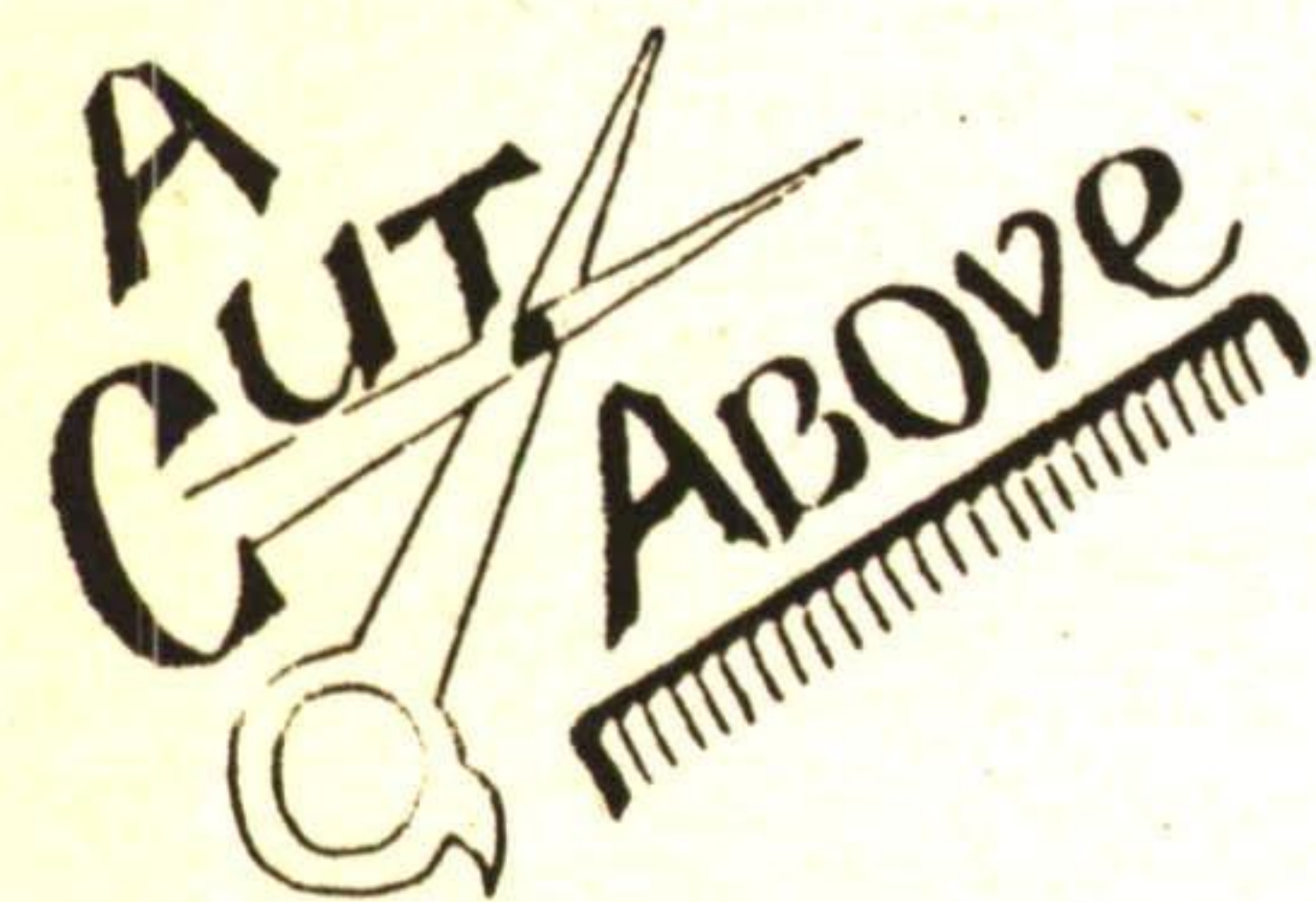
ensure they meet standard building codes, while Serjeantson suggested Georgetown South's growth be controlled to protect the environment.

Norton emphatically stated the roads must be curbed and guttered, and parks for the Georgetown South area must be planned for sooner. Also, traffic lights at Mountainview Rd. and Delrex Blvd. should be installed to make school children crossing easier.

Cook agreed that Silver Creek valley must be protected and the area's parks be completed as soon as possible. He added that Irwin St.'s walkway should be have lights to make it safer at night.

Chatten supported his colleagues' suggested, but added everything must be prioritized to provide a balance where the money is spent.

Gord Chapman again pressed for a commitment from the candidates on the Acton arena, but only Walton firmly supported its construction in 1993. The other candidates agreed the arena is a priority, but did not want to commit themselves before the funds are available.
