

Police beat

Garage break-in

A garage on Mill St. in Acton was broken into and two bikes, valued at \$3,000, were stolen during the day on Wednesday, police said.

There was no sign of forced entry and the house wasn't entered. One mountain bike worth \$1,000 and a custom built racing bike worth \$2,000 were taken, police said.

Nintendo stolen

There were no signs of entry at a Norval home which was broken into Wednesday during the day,

police said. However, they did have a suspect, and called him in the evening to tell him to return the Nintendo, Halton Regional Police said. The next morning it was found at the front door of the house. The suspect, who is a young offender, may have used a hidden key to enter the house, then broke a lock on a kitchen cupboard using tools from a nearby drawer, and removed a Nintendo Gameboy. Three Fisher stereo components were taken from the living room at the same time, police said. Police have not yet charged anyone with the break-in.

Lumber stolen

About \$1,100 worth of roofing lumber was stolen from Leather-town Lumber overnight Tuesday. Police believe a large truck was driven into the lumber yard after the gate was broken. The stolen wood included 50 sheets of spruce and 100 2X6 inch by 12 foot pieces of spruce lumber.

A woman resting in bed at her 10th Line home at 12:30 a.m. Wednesday heard banging on the door. She thought her husband had locked himself out, and yelled, "just a minute." When she arrived at the door, she found knob broken and a \$100 worth of damage. Police believe the intruder was scared off by the occupant.
