

So now we have our council for the next three years. Some of the


faces have changed while many remain the same. They will all face of three years that will probably try their patience as well as the patience of the residents of Halton


Only time will tell, and hopefully, we'll all remember who were the talkers and who were the doers the next time they approach the people.


