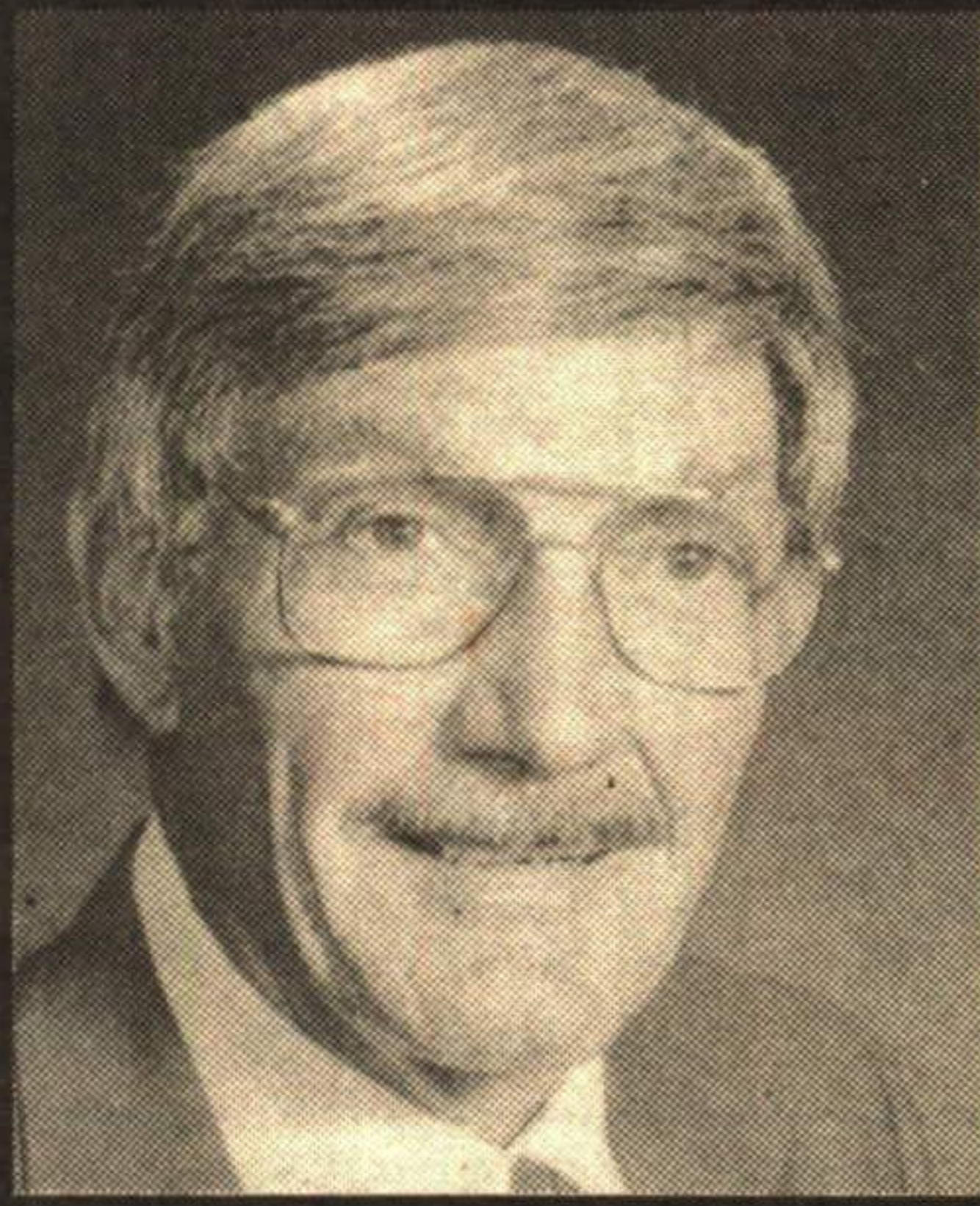

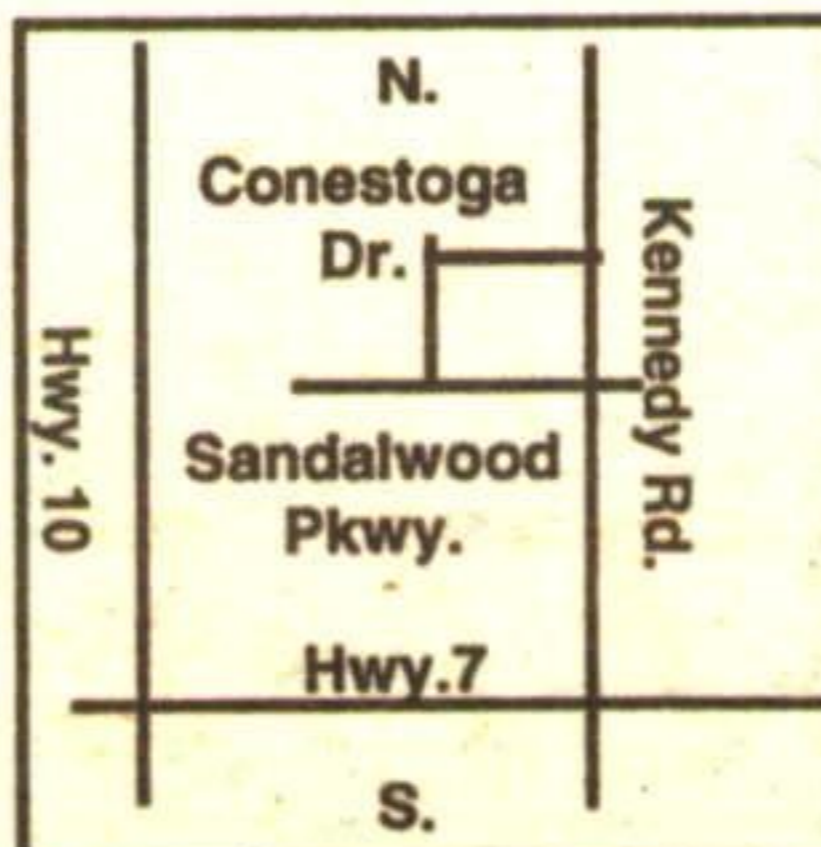

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 30, 1991 IN GEORGETOWN

On Monday, November 25, 1991, the Council, of The Corporation of The Town of Halton Hills, intends to pass a by-law to close, temporarily, various roads in the Town of Halton Hills (Georgetown) on Saturday, November 30, 1991, from approximately 1:00 P.M., until approximately 3:00 P.M., for the purpose of the Georgetown Lions Club Inc.'s Annual Santa Claus Parade. The parade route will be as follows:

The parade will form on Sinclair Avenue, travel through the Georgetown Market to Mountainview Road at Campbell Gate, follow Mountainview Road to Guelph Street, Guelph Street to Maple Avenue, Maple Avenue to Main Street, and Main Street to James Street where it will disperse.

The Council Meeting will be held at 7:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers, 1 Halton Hills Drive. At this meeting, Council will hear, in person, or by his counsel, any person who claims his lands will be prejudicially affected by the said by-law and who applies to the Town Clerk at 873-2600, before the Council Meeting.
