Discussion paper

As many of you already know, Labour Minister Bob Mackenzie recently released a Queen's Discussion Paper on reform of the Labour Relations Act. I'd like to talk about our reasons for looking at ways to update Ontario's outmoded labour laws.

The Labour Relations Act has not been significantly reformed in more than 15 years. The workplace, however, has changed dramatically during that same time period, and there has been a fundamental restructuring of Ontario's economy, its workplaces, the composition of the workforce, and the nature of the jobs workers perform. Women and ethnic minorities have entered the workforce in large numbers. There are also more part-time workers. The changes in the economy include the disappearance of more and more manufacturing jobs and the rise in low-paying service sector employment, but the current Act is geared to the needs of a primarily male workforce employed in large workplaces typically in the manufacturing sector.

The release of the Discussion Paper on November 7 marks the beginning of a three month consultation period. The paper looks at a number of preferred options and directions, and the consultation process will allow us to hear your views about the need for changes. Consultations will take place in 10 locations across the province, namely, Toronto, Windsor, London, Ottawa, Hamilton, Thunder Bay, Sudbury, Kingston, Timmins and Sault Ste. Marie. In each centre, Labour Minister Bob Mackenzie or Sharon Murdock, Parliamentary Assistant, will meet with interested groups. The Discussion Paper is our first publicly stated position on labour relations reform.




