The third period saw Georgetown in control pressing hard with many opportunities but came up short.

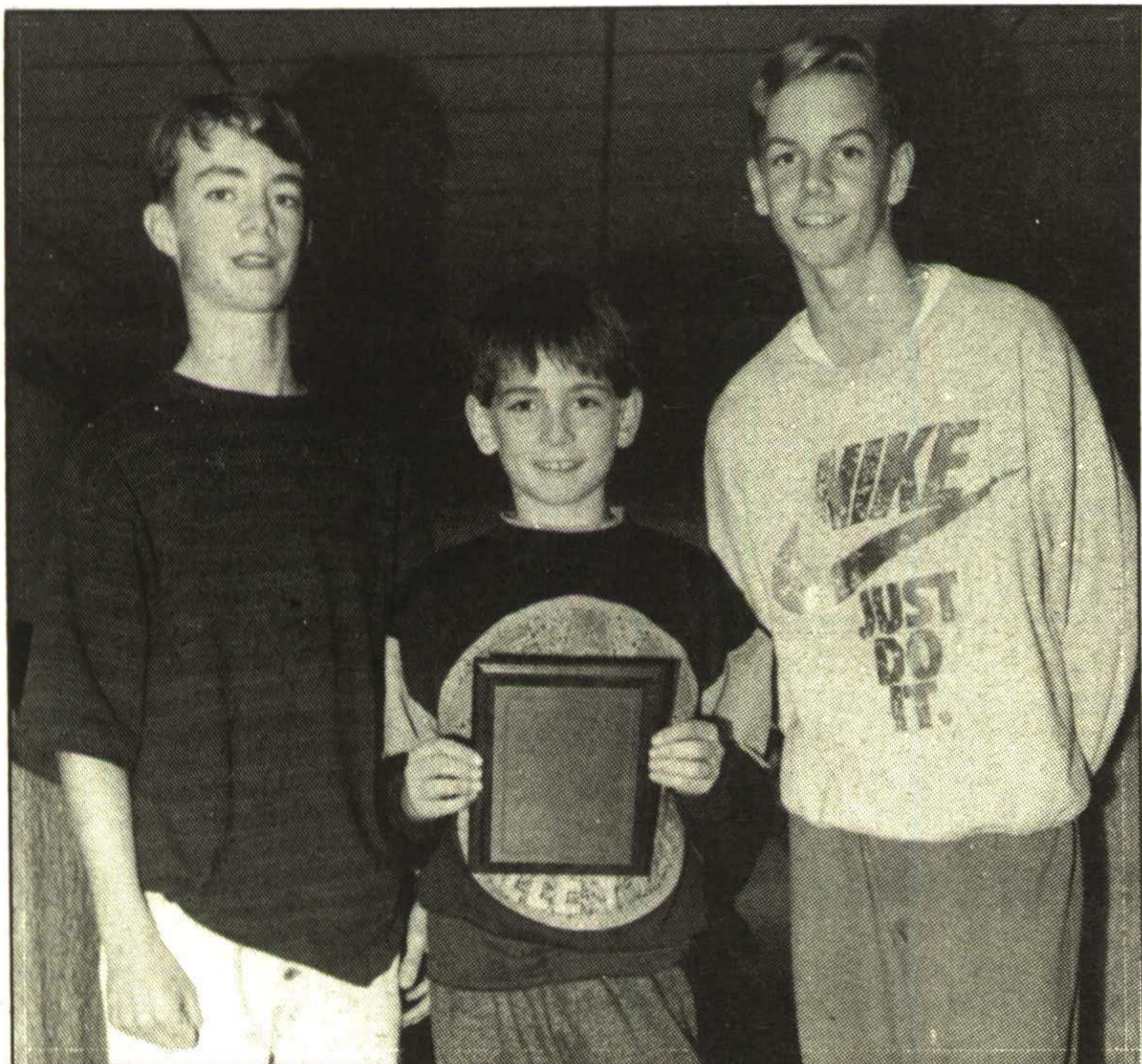
