## Three Raiders named to All-Star team

Georgetown Chrysler Raiders are sending three players into this year's Central Ontario All-Star showdown in Orillia.

Defenceman Rob Doucette, goaltender Carmelo Guirleo and left winger Todd McKee will don skates along with the rest of the best from the west for the Jan. 11 contest against the eastern division's finest.

"We're real proud," Raiders general manager Finn Poulstrup said of the announcement that three Georgetown players were among All-Stars chosen from the division's eight teams. "That's a great showing for our guys."

Milton Merchants coach Rick Bince, delighted to be chosen himself to coach the Western All-Stars for the third time in four years, admits the player selection wasn't easy, with each team's top talent nominated.

But Bince said in an interview Friday he's already got the lines established for the midseason classic, which he described as a "fun day" full of high quality hockey.

Players and fans will make a full day of the competition and related festivities in Orillia. Game time is 2 p.m.

Bince knows he'll start with Merchants goalie Jason Chipman, who currently owns the best goals-against average, but he's not sure yet who's in the net next.

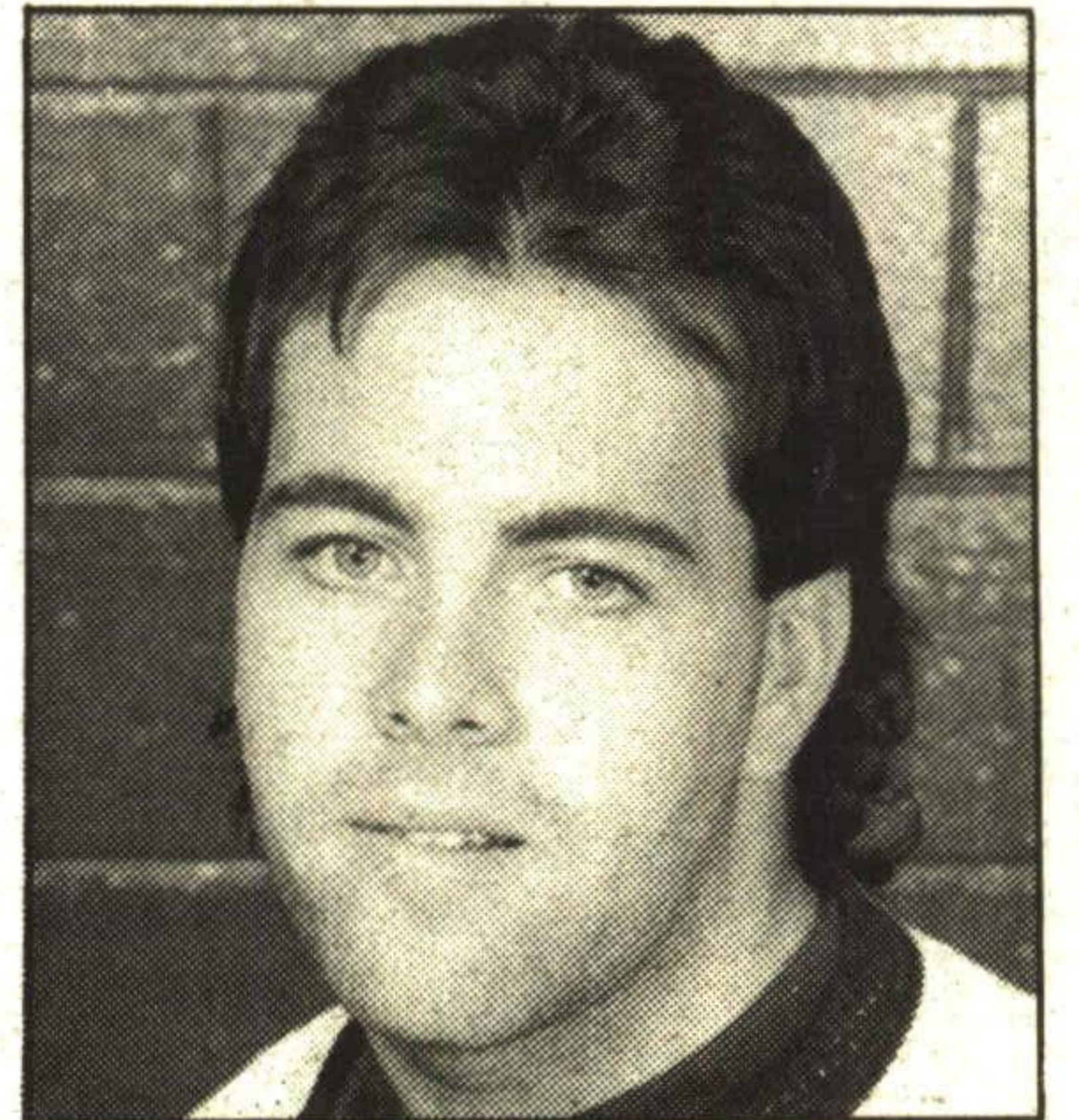
He called Guirleo, whom the Raiders acquired from the Sudbury Wolves in early October, "very, very strong" in action this season against Milton.

Doucette is a known quantity for Bince, who called the Raider veteran "a quality hockey player." It shows in his All-Star record: he's been picked for the team four times.

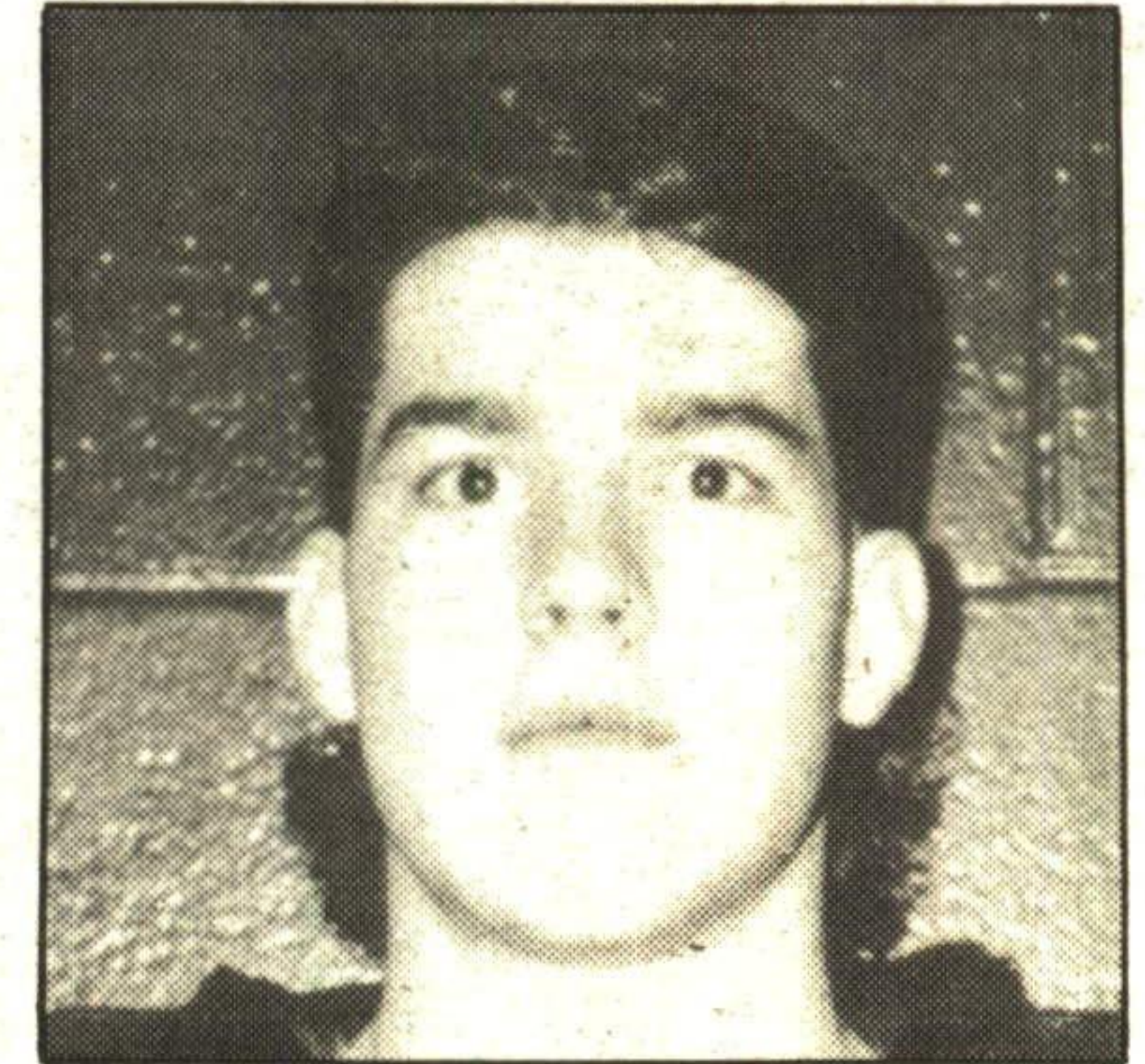
