

Stereo stolen

A CD stereo and some speakers, valued at \$5,000 to \$8,000 were stolen from a 1979 Chevrolet Mailibu when it was parked overnight December 27 on Mill St. near Main St. in Georgetown.

Chairs stolen

Two wing chairs, valued at \$900, were removed from the lobby at the Sands on McFarlane Dr. in Georgetown Christmas Day. The chairs were pink and had padded arms and Queen Anne legs. Police believe thieves would have needed a van.

Porche totalled

A 1976 Porsche was totalled in an accident in Hungry Hollow in Georgetown December 26. The Toronto driver was southbound on the Ninth Line when the car hit a patch of "black ice," crossed the centre line, struck a hydro pole on the other side of the road and stopped south of the hydro pole, police said. The driver was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital by ambulance and treated for minimal injuries. No charges were laid, police said.

House entered

A house on Mill St. in Acton was entered by the east door on the afternoon or evening of December 29, but nothing was taken. Police said a woman was visiting her parents and returned home to find the VCR and light turned on, and jewellery box ransacked. Police believe the suspect used a key to enter, and left by the same door, relocking it.

Abandoned car fire

A car left unattended in a laneway off Five Sideroad near the Tenth Line received an undetermined amount of fire

damage late December 27, according to the Fire Department. The fire began in the passenger area, but the driver could not be located. The abandoned vehicle is owned by an Etobicoke resident, according to the Fire Department.

RIDE results

On New Year's Eve, 1,508 cars were stopped in Halton Hills and Milton by Halton Regional Police for spot checks. One person was arrested for impaired driving, two were given 12-hour suspensions, six were charged with Highway Traffic Act offences and 10 warnings were issued, police said.



Alcohol charges

There were eight alcohol-related charges in Halton Hills on New Year's Eve. Seven people were charged with being intoxicated in public places and the eighth person was charged with impaired driving, police said. The holding cells were full that night, police said.

Break and enter

A trailer was broken into sometime between Dec. 24 and 27 and a chainsaw and a generator were removed. The trailer is at Lindsay Ct. and Trafalgar Rd. The suspects pushed in a window to gain entry, police said, and exited the same way.

Store bilked

A suspect convinced a Georgetown store employee to give him \$100 cash Tuesday. The man said

he needed the money to pay the garage for his car repair before the garage closed at 11:30 a.m. The clerk repeatedly refused the man, but then the man pretended to have a phone conversation with the owner, police said. The man was given the money, and promised to return by noon the next day with the cash. Police have a full description of the man. A similar incident occurred at a different store last summer.

Man assaults nephew

A Norval man accused his nephew of having an affair with his wife Wednesday. The nephew tried to leave the premises, but the man pushed the victim to the ground and punched him in the mouth, police said. As he was being charged with assault, police discovered there was a warrant out for his arrest because of some outstanding fines. The man had been given some time to pay the fines, but did not, police said. As a result, he was transported to Maplehurst Correctional Centre to serve 14 days.

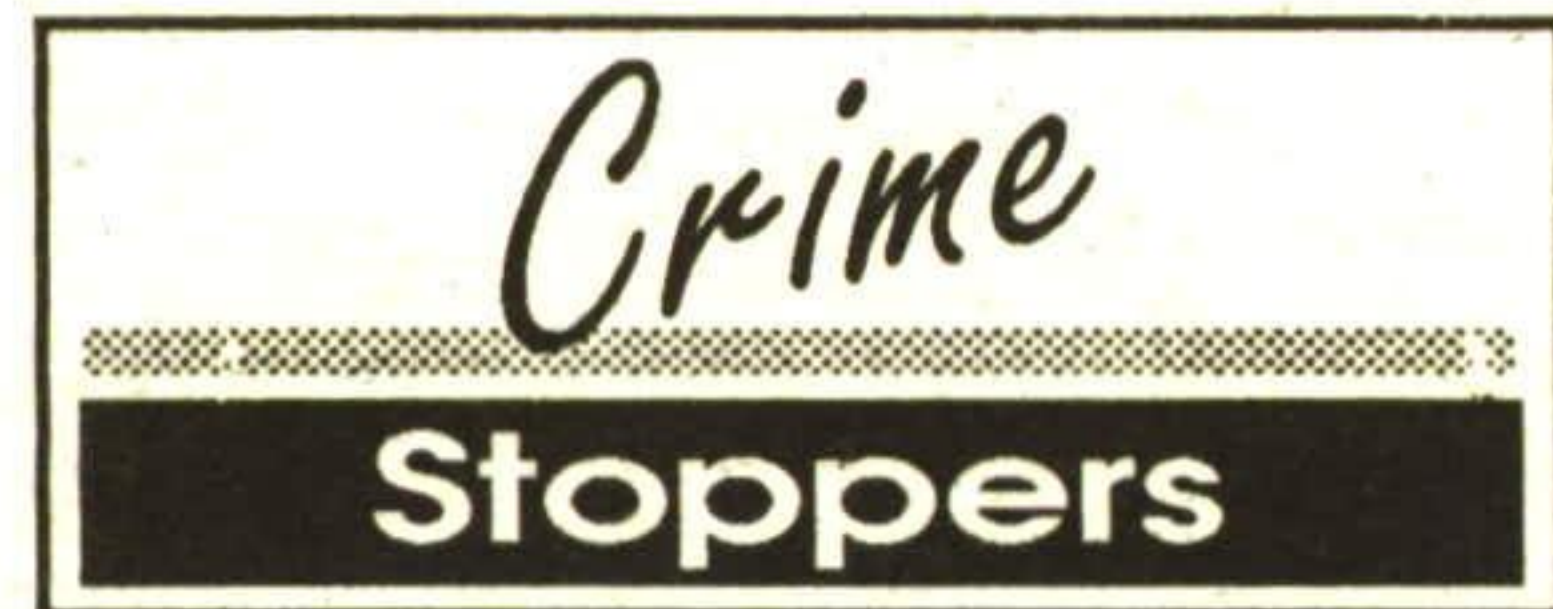
Woman assaulted

Police search for Georgetown burglars

Georgetown detachment and Crime Stoppers of Halton are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the criminals who entered a Georgetown home and made off with \$19,000

in cash and belongings.

Residents of the Eleanor Cres. home returned from work Dec. 2 at about 6 p.m. to find they were the victims of a burglary. Unknown culprits entered the residence by an unlocked garage door and ransacked the entire house.

Besides \$7,000 in U.S. cash and \$2,000 in Canadian funds, the culprits made off with a Sharps word processor and fax machine, a JVC video camera, a Nikon camera, a Coda

answering machine, a Seiko black-face watch, a 14-karat gold Seiko ladies' watch, an 18-karat gold bracelet, a diamond, pearl and ruby necklace and earrings and a three-quarter length Danier leather coat.

If you have information that leads to an arrest in this or any other offence, you may be eligible for a cash reward of up to \$1,000. You need not give your name, and your information will be treated as anonymous.

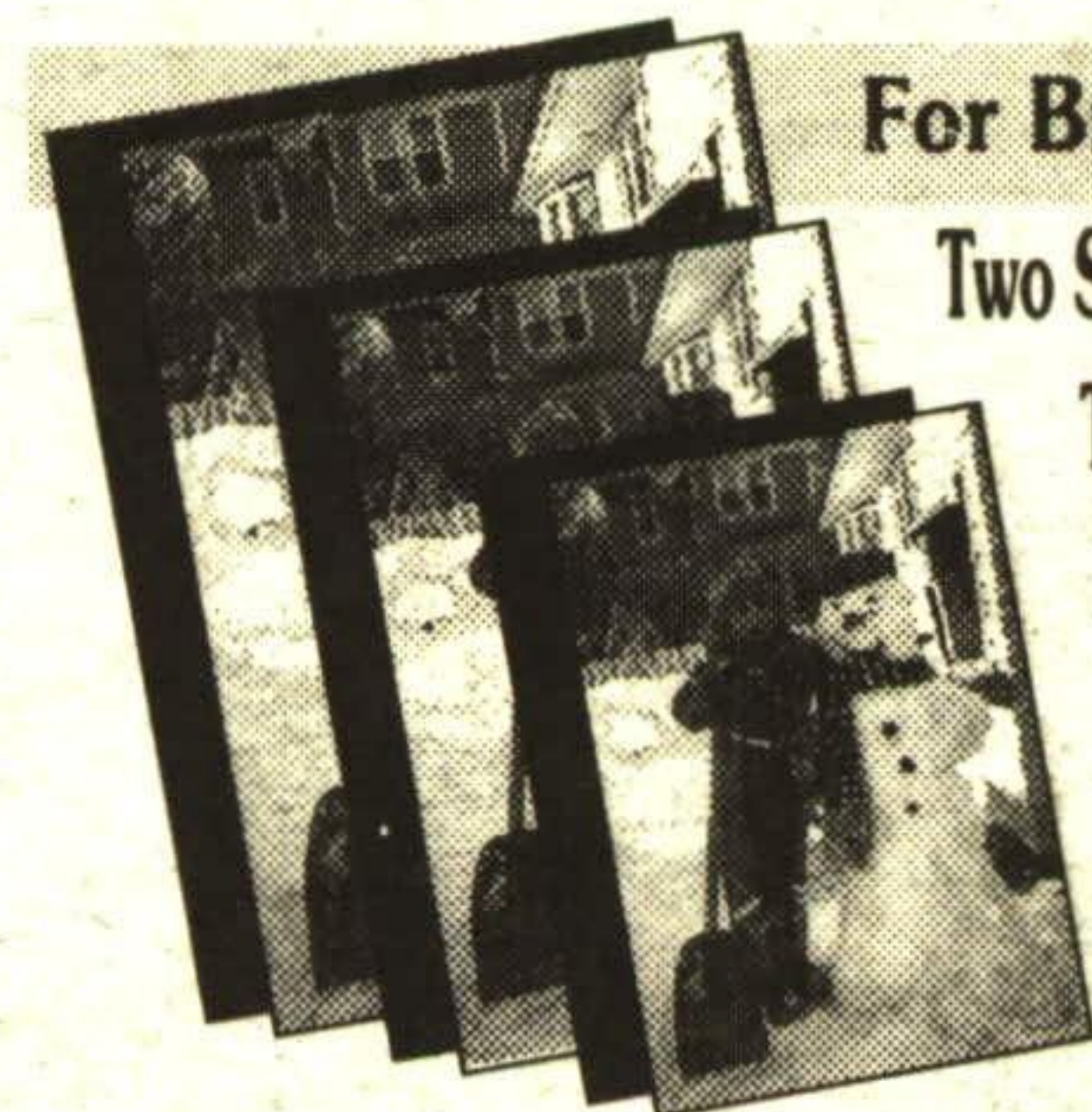
