

Police seek suspect responsible for assault

The Halton Regional Police in Milton and Crime Stoppers of Halton are asking for the community's assistance in identifying the man responsible for an assault upon two children, ages 10 and 11 years.

On Thursday, Nov. 14, three young boys were playing hide and seek in the townhouse complex at 741 Woodward Ave., Milton. At approximately 8:15 p.m., a brown, four-door car, believed to be a 1983-1986 Chevrolet Malibu with several square tail lights drove into the complex. There was a man in late 40s to early 50s driving the car and a female passenger. The driver questioned one of the boys as to what they were doing and then drove around the complex twice and left.

A short time later this same man came back on foot and approached the boys. He yelled at them to come over to him and then chased one of the boys. He caught one young fellow and grabbed him by the throat and threw him up against the building. He then carried the first victim over to where the second victim was standing and he grabbed the



second boy by the throat and told him he was going to hurt them both much worse if he ever sees them again. The suspect released both boys and they ran home and reported the incident to police.

The suspect is described as a male, white, 45-50 years of age, medium build, with short whitish/grey hair, wearing large glasses and a brown jacket (possibly suede) and black pants.

The assault upon these two young boys was totally unprovoked. The suspect's vehicle was last seen in the immediate area or Briar Cres. in Milton.
